

Parish Council

Following a "spike" in Covid 19 infections in the village, it was decided to postpone the Annual Parish Meeting and the meeting of the Parish Council which were due to be held on 10th March 2022. Whilst most of those infected seem to have experienced relatively mild symptoms these were debilitating for some and a reminder that the Covid pandemic has not yet ended. It is important to continue to take precautions and reduce needless risk.

The postponed meetings will now take place on **Tuesday 12th May 2022 starting at 7.00pm in the Village Hall**. The Annual Parish Meeting is separate from the meeting of the Parish Council and can be used by anyone living in the village to raise local issues of current interest for discussion. As in previous years this APM will include reports by village organisations on their activities over the past twelve months and on current projects affecting the village.

Notices about the Parish Council meeting, including the agenda, will be posted on the village noticeboards and on the village website. The agenda will include consideration of the responses received to the consultation on whether to request that 20mph speed limits be introduced in the village. Many of those responses indicated that priority should also be given to tackling the problem of speeding along the High Road/Broad Chalke Road. The Parish Council has made two attempts over the last few years to persuade Wiltshire Council to extend the 30mph limit westwards to the Broad Chalke side of the Flamstone Street junction. Despite strong backing from John Glen MP this has always been refused. However, our Wiltshire Councillor, Nabil Najjar, has established a new group, made up of representatives of the parish councils in his division, to discuss joint action on subjects such as speeding. It is Cllr Najjar's view that Wiltshire Council may be more open to changes to speed limits than in the past. The Parish Council will pursue the objective of extension of the 30mph limit through this new group.

The first meeting of that group was also attended by a representative of the Police and Crime Commissioner. Additional resources are to be deployed to tackle speeding in the county and it is proposed to re-launch the Community Speed Watch programme in the Summer with extra support from the Police for community speed watch groups. Of course, any action in Bishopstone will depend on whether some new volunteers come forward to form such a group. More on this in a future edition of STaB.

During April it is intended that the new play equipment for the Children's Play Area will be installed and, in due course, the existing football goal refurbished and re-sited. The play equipment will comprise the two "springers" – a see-saw and a van – which are for the use of the very youngest of villagers.

At the end of March thirty young trees were planted on the north side of the Recreation Field. These are the parish's contribution to the "Queen's Green Canopy" campaign to mark the Jubilee. Many thanks go to Cllr Simon Williams and his team for organizing this and for planting the trees.

Salisbury Foodbank

This month we had 3.9 kgs of donations. Thank you so much.

This month there has been a plea from the Trussell Trust in their emails which I feel I should quote in full for everyone's information:-

"One in six people who receive Universal Credit needed to visit a food bank at least once since the start of December. Almost 2 m people were currently going without food, while others were living in cold conditions as they couldn't afford to power and heat their homes.

We cannot stand by and let the UK government allow this to get worse. People are already facing impossible decisions such as heating or eating, with many having to take on debt just to get by. People said they were unable to afford to get to work or get children to school, some have said they have mould growing in their home because they can't afford heating, some were turning off their fridges to save money and several people highlighted an imminent risk of homelessness.

The planned 3.1% uprating of benefits in April won't cover even half of the cost of living reality as inflation rages. Without urgent action, the cost of essentials we all need to get by will be completely out of reach for people already struggling to make ends meet. The Treasury must uprate benefits this spring, including Universal Credit, legacy benefits and support for housing costs, by the forecast rate of inflation of at least 7%. We will not stand by and allow thousands more families to be pushed into debt with no way out and forced through the doors of food banks."

Please if you can, continue to support this very worthy cause in whatever way you are able. You can donate food at most of the supermarkets now but I am still happy to take along anything that is brought to me here at home, or left in our lovely church.

Bishopstone Ultrafast Broadband Update



Salisbury - the Fibre City and the end of copper cabling plus a project update

By the end of June 2020 Openreach "fully fibred" Salisbury. What did that mean?

Some 22,000 premises in the city were able to access the gigabit capable Fibre to the Premises (FTTP) network, the type of service which will soon be extended to the western half of Bishopstone.

This action meant that Salisbury was the first entire city in the UK to gain access to the Openreach FTTP network.

Anyone moving around the city in the last year will have seen a plethora of Openreach staff laying some 500km of new fibre-optic cable, digging some 30kms of trenches and clearing some 720+ blockages. The average quoted build rate was 59 properties per day. (Source: Research carried out by Openreach). We know that as cities go Salisbury is small, but it is a useful testbed for Openreach to experiment, prior adopting new approaches to boost the roll out of FTTP across the whole of the UK.

The actual migration trial is due to run until the end of this year. Because of this project Salisbury has also been chosen to take part in the Exchange Upgrade Trial (i.e. switching off copper and going full fibre). More on this in a moment!

As far as our project in the village is concerned it seems likely that fibre optic cabling will be routed to the village from Coombe Bissett. Parts of Coombe Bissett and the eastern end of Bishopstone already have FTTP which, in turn, is routed from Salisbury. This will be different from our current arrangement in the West of the village where our cabling comes from the Broad Chalke exchange to the green cabinet at the end of Flamstone Street.

Associated with this exercise is Openreach's Exchange Upgrade Trial. The trial in Salisbury is in process and the current plan is to put a "stop sell" on any new copper services. There are some misconceptions as to what this will mean and we will try to cover those next month.

As at the time of writing this note (18 March) Openreach have been back in the village working on and completing the underground links to a few properties that had been highlighted during the previous visit by engineers in January.

As of today we have no further news on the start date for the full project.

Our second new football goal post has arrived and is out on the sports field, so we now have a great kick about pitch for all the family to enjoy. This is a great resource to hire for birthday parties, and we had our first of these a couple of weeks ago.

Outdoor basketball has continued to be well used since being installed a few weeks ago, so much so that one of the balls has worn out! If anyone has a spare basketball or two, and would like to donate please let us know. We aim to keep a couple of balls in the storage net so anyone can turn up, play, and return the basketballs to the net for the next family to enjoy.

A lot of work is being undertaken planning replacement of the floodlights on the multisports area. We are working with the Cranborne Chase AONB as part of the International Dark Skies Reserve so that we plan new lighting in line with their recommendations.

At the time of writing this Newsletter we are also planning our next major development. Together with the Cricket Club, we have raised over £4,000 to install a new cricket practice facility. This will see the laying of an artificial grass practice bay together with a cricket cage and net. We are always looking for new players and will be starting practice evenings in May, so just turn up and join us.

Just a reminder of what else is on. The football season will draw to a conclusion later this month: The new Thursday afternoon 2.00-4.00 short mat bowls session has now started, and the Monday evening session takes place as normal. Petanque will be moving back outdoors on Friday evenings from the first Friday in May, and will continue indoors until then, so come and join us you, will be made most welcome.

Long speculated as a hospitable place for human life, it features many science fiction novels, the most famous probably being "The War of the Worlds" by H.G. Wells.

It is known today by its Roman name after the God of War due to its distinct red colour, redolent of blood, but on closer inspection of the surface there are different shades and other colours including green. Mars itself has 2 tiny moons with Greek names Phobos and Deimos, both about 13 miles in diameter

Once there were oceans covering huge areas of its surface, but due to Mars' lack of strong magnetic field, the solar wind broke up the water molecules and most water was lost, but left some oxygen, which oxidised the rocks giving the planet's red rust colour. The solar wind also damaged rock surfaces, leading to red dust which can be whipped up by winds and deposited in dunes. The ancients thought that there were "canals" on Mars, which was almost true as they are massive waterless river beds up to 2,300 km long, with dried up lake beds and waterfalls up to 4 km high.

The surface is lunar, magma studded with impact craters of all sizes, and basaltic maria (solid seas of solidified magma). Volcanic activity stopped 3,500 million years ago, when the planet cooled (much smaller and further away from the sun than earth). However, in Olympus Mons it has the largest volcano in the solar system at over 13.6 miles high and 375 miles wide.

At a very similar tilt as Earth to the ecliptic, Mars has similar seasons. The poles in "winter" show large areas of white solid carbon dioxide, but this overlies permanent water ice. Daylight on Mars is pinkish-red, with blue sunsets.

Many missions have been carried out to Mars and more are planned, but the possibility of life ever existing there is receding.

Recipe of the Month - Marmalade Pudding Cake (or Paddington's Breakfast Cake)

This is a fabulously easy recipe which involves popping all ingredients into a food processor. Nigella Lawson suggests serving it warm at a Sunday lunch with custard. But this week I made it for Playgroup and as it was at 9.30am, I decided to rename it Paddington's Breakfast Cake.

- 250g soft unsalted butter (plus some for greasing)
- 75g caster sugar
- 75g light brown muscovado sugar
- 150g marmalade
- 225g plain flour
- ¹/₂ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 4 large eggs
- zest and juice of ½ orange
- √₂ orange
- Glaze: 75g marmalade & juice of ½ orange

Preheat the oven to 180° C/ 160° C Fan/gas mark $4/350^{\circ}$ F and butter a 24cm / 8inch square ovenproof dish. Put the 75g marmalade and juice of $\frac{1}{2}$ orange into a small pan and set aside to make a glaze later.

Put all the other ingredients for the pudding batter into a food processor, process them and then pour and scrape the batter into the buttered dish, smoothing the top. If you're not using a processor, cream the butter and both sugars by hand or in a freestanding mixer, beat in the marmalade followed by the dry ingredients, then the eggs and finally the orange zest and juice

Put in the oven and cook for about 40 minutes – though give a first check after $\frac{1}{2}$ hour – by which time the sponge mixture will have risen and a cake tester will come out cleanish. Remove from the oven and leave in the dish.

Warm the glaze mixture in the pan until melted together, then paint the top of the sponge (or pierce the cake with a skewer and allow some of the glaze to dribble through into the sponge creating a more moist cake), letting the chunks or slivers of peel be your sole, unglinting decoration on top of the mutely gleaming pudding-cake. Know that this sponge will keep its orange-scented warmth for quite a while once out of the oven, so you could make it before you sit down for the main course.

Use a large spoon or cake slice (or both) to serve, and put a jug of custard or cream on the table to eat with.

Sarah's Gardening Tips for April

- 1. Tie in climbing and rambling roses.
- 2. Apply a high nitrogen feed to the lawn for a boost to the start of the season.
- 3. Sow beans directly or in individual pots. Runner beans don't like root disturbance so don't pot them on, get them into the ground.
- 4. Pinch out the tips of Fuschias and sweet peas to make them bush out.
- 5. Prune fig trees.
- 6. Mulch fruit trees with well rotted manure or garden compost but don't mound around the trunk.
- 7. Prune penstemons now. Cut back old shoots to the base provided there is new growth.
- 8. Hedges often provide nesting sites for garden birds so leave pruning until late summer.
- 9. Order annual plants for summer bedding, online or from catalogues.
