Parish Council

The latest meeting of the Parish Council took place on Tuesday 5th July. The main business was to consider the problem of speeding in the village, both along the main High Road/Broadchalke Road and in the local village roads. This part of the discussion is reported separately in this edition of STaB.

One of those who attended the meeting was Nicky Rigg, who had indicated a willingness to be co-opted to become a member of the Council to fill the vacancy left by the retirement of John Gibbon. The Chairman, Cllr Ali Thorne, welcomed Nicky to the meeting and, in subsequent discussion, Councillors unanimously approved her appointment.

Wiltshire Councillor Nabil Najjar also attended the meeting and gave a brief update on Wiltshire Council affairs. He said that the budget for the year (£480m) was tight given the effects of inflation but should be enough to protect essential services and there was slightly increased provision for work to repair and maintain rural roads. However, there was less money for the Area Board and any bids for project funding should be submitted as soon as possible.

Among the other matters covered, the Clerk reported that work to re-instate or repair the road name boards in The Styles, Harvest Lane and The Croft (Harvest Lane entrance) was underway. Discussions had been undertaken with Wiltshire Council's Highway Engineer about the problem of dangerous gullies at the side of the road up to the Racecourse. The gullies had been filled with loose stone "scalpings" but this was not an adequate permanent solution. A request had been submitted to the specialist team for a more permanent repair to be made but it was uncertain how quickly any action will be taken. Discussions had also taken place with various departments of Wiltshire Council to get the repairs to the fence by the pedestrian bridge in The Alley completed and the dead tree on the corner of The Styles removed and, hopefully, replaced. The semi-demolished tree by the bus shelter at the Recreation Field will be removed once the harvest is completed in the adjoining field.

Consideration was given to the planning application for the replacement of the bungalow known as Sanclive in Chapel Lane by a five bedroomed detached house. Councillors welcomed the fact that it was only proposed to put one new dwelling on the site, though regretted the loss of a smaller, relatively affordable, housing unit in the village. It was agreed not to object to the proposal but to submit comments covering, amongst other things, the need to safeguard against any further development of the site and to support comments already submitted by Wiltshire Council's Land Drainage Team regarding the need to submit a proper flood risk/ drainage assessment.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on <u>Thursday 8th September</u> <u>2022</u> at the slightly later time of 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

Speeding in the Village

The main business of the meeting of the Parish Council on 5th July was to discuss the issue of speeding in the village. There were two main aspects of this: the speed limits along the main High Road/Broadchalke Road and whether to bid



for the introduction of 20mph limits on the local village roads - an issue which was the subject of public consultation at the end of 2021.

The Parish Council has made several attempts in the past to get the speed limit for the section of Broadchalke Road past the Recreation Field and the White Hart reduced from 40mph to 30mph. The section past Whitlock Rise and the Pitts Lane junction already has a 30mph limit and it has always seemed an anomaly that the section where there is most pedestrian use of the road (with the designated crossing point to the Recreation Field, Children's Play Area and bus stop and access to the pub) should have a 40mph limit. The last attempt to get the limit reduced was in 2017 and, despite strong backing from John Glen MP, this was refused by Wiltshire Council.

At the last election the incoming administration in Wiltshire made road safety and tackling speeding a priority. Our Councillor, Cllr Nabil Najjar, has indicated that the authority may be more open to proposals for reducing speed limits in villages than in the past if there was strong community support. He attended this meeting of the Parish Council and said that, in his view, the best case for reducing the limit can be made if it is combined with a similar request for reduced limits in Broad Chalke parish, thus securing an integrated approach and greater consistency to speed limits along the main valley road (C12). The Parish Council decided to make this issue a priority and to provide Cllr Najjar with such support material as was necessary to make the case for change.

The meeting also discussed the case for submitting a request to Wiltshire Council for 20mph limits to be introduced on the local roads following the public consultation carried out in last December's edition of STaB. Consideration of this issue had been delayed whilst an additional metro count was undertaken in Mill Lane in order to provide a comprehensive picture in the village.

The complete metro count results were as follows (see over page):

Location	Total vehicle movements (both directions combined).	Average speed of vehicles (both directions) - MPH	85 th percentile (both directions) - MPH
Flamstone St	530	15.7	21.1
Butt Lane	2390	18.2	23.0
Harvest Lane	1786	20.7	26.0
Church Lane	962	18.6	23.9
Faulston Lane	897	16.0	20.8
Mill Lane	175	18.3	26.55

These counts show that <u>average</u> speeds at the survey locations are already less than 20mph. Even at the 85th percentile level, apart from Harvest Lane and Mill Lane, they are only marginally above. Both national and local research indicates that the imposition of 20mph limits reduces traffic speed at the average level by 1-2mph. At the level of the 85th percentile the reduction is only about 0.5mph. In other words, those who are already travelling at speeds in excess of 20mph will continue to do so despite the imposition of any limit. The police do not generally enforce within 20mph areas.

Just over 20 responses were received to the public consultation. 12 of these were in favour of introducing speed limits, even if the effect was very limited. 11 responses were against the proposal, citing the fact that average speeds are already below 20mph, the lack of enforcement and the cost, both financial (over £9,000 overall) and environmental, with the proliferation of speed limit repeater signs through the village. The responses to the consultation are summarized in the paper considered by Councillors, which is available on the village website.

The Parish Council concluded that the mixed response to the 20mph limits proposal hardly amounted to the "strong community support" mentioned by Councillor Najjar and an application should not be submitted at the present time. Much more was to be gained in terms of improved road safety in the village by concentrating on the reduction of speed limits along Broadchalke Road. Since the meeting Cllr Najjar has begun the process of raising this issue of speed limits along the valley road with Cllr Mark McClelland, the Wiltshire Cabinet Member for Transport. Progress on this matter will be reported in future editions of STaB.

Police Bulletin

A new monthly newsletter from Philip Wilkinson, Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire.



You will already be aware the police force watchdog HMICFRS has placed Wiltshire Police into 'special measures' as a result of its performance. The Inspectorate's report is a sobering read and is highly disappointing, as I know it will be to our county's residents. It's especially disheartening because I know Wiltshire Police has many dedicated officers, staff and volunteers, working hard to deliver a quality, efficient, frontline service.

But this report makes it clear - there are areas of concern Wiltshire Police need to address: victims of crime, vulnerable people and our communities deserve better. You had told me this in volume when I was on your doorstep and the results of my countywide survey and consultation only confirmed this, as well as from local councillors and MPs, on the policing service they were getting.

We now have a police and crime plan which ensures Wiltshire Police will meet and deliver those priorities influenced by you, focused on delivering a service the public want and prioritising those crimes that matter most to communities.

The necessary remedial measures needed to make the improvements highlighted in the report are already in progress and my immediate priority is to ensure that Wiltshire's Chief Constable, and his senior leadership team, move with focus and speed, particularly in the Force's response to the public and to vulnerable people and victims, in dramatically improving performance and the quality and effectiveness of investigations.

My aim, alongside the Chief Constable, is for Wiltshire Police to prioritise those crimes which matter most to communities so we can satisfy the Inspectorate but, more importantly, we can satisfy you as residents. Working together, the Chief Constable and I have already agreed on a back-to-basics reset for the Force so I can assure you the process of change is already progressing.

I expect to see a tangible change in service delivery and the Chief Constable has reassured me the necessary changes are in place. I will be receiving regular progress reports from him, and his senior leadership team, to ensure those remedial actions are completed as soon as possible.

Thankfully many residents do not need to use our policing service frequently but when they do, the service they receive should be a quality, frontline, response. I will continue to ask for those assurances on behalf of Wiltshire's residents and ensure Wiltshire Police is delivering on behalf of all of the communities it serves.

Still Rambling with Jazzie

We are now back from our week's holiday in St Malo, and Jazzie is back home again. She is much relieved to be in her garden, after a week in the kennels near here. There are several car parks about 2 km inland, all paying, and shuttle buses to the Mont. But it is all so crowded. We got through the gates, and as far a Mere Poulard's Café (where the omelettes are world-famous) and turned



round to go home. It was awful, too many people and too much noise and very, very hot!! Perhaps we are getting too old to travel now?

The garden is scorched and needs water or rain, as is evident everywhere. During our absence, it has got a lot hotter, and everywhere looks burnt. We hope the wheat and barley harvest is not spoilt, and will be another success. We have watered again since our return, but not done much more in the garden. It has been too hot. As I write today there is cloud in the sky and it is cooler, but still very warm. I do hope it really rains for us, and for the garden and the water butts. 








Recipe of the Month - Courgette Saute

Are you overwhelmed with courgettes yet? We certainly are here at STaB HQ, and we are always looking for different ways to eat them. This Courgette Saute is a quick and simple way to do so, and we have it most days over the summer, served hot as a supper accompaniment, or cold as a lunchtime salad.

Cut 1 medium, or 2 small courgettes into 'matchsticks' (I do this by cutting them into diagonal slices about 5mm thick, then cut the slices into sticks. Heat a large frying pan over medium-high heat and add enough oil to coat the pan well. Heat the oil until hot but not smoking, then add 2 tbsp sliced almonds to the pan. Cook them, stirring, until the almonds are golden-brown, approximately a minute or two. Don't skimp on this step; they provide a depth of flavour that carries the whole dish. Add the courgettes to the pan, tossing it with the oil and almonds until it just begins to glisten, about one minute. The idea is not to cook the courgette so much as warm it so it begins to soften. Season well with salt and pepper, slide onto a plate, top with shaved Parmesan (optional, I rarely do) and immediately dig in.



The best way to help the shop is to buy things! But there are other ways to help.

Sarah's Gardening Tips for August and September

- 1. Water fruit and veg plants daily.
- 2. Keep patio container plants watered and feed them fortnightly with a liquid feed.
- 3. Trim lavender after flowering to keep them compact.
- 4. Mow meadows now to help scatter established wildflower seeds.
- 5. Prune climbing and rambling roses now if they have finished flowering but not if they are repeat flowering, wait until after they finish.
- 6. Take cuttings of tender perennials such as pelargoniums and fuchsia to propagate them for next year.
- 7. Pinch out the tips of runner bean plants to stop them growing above the supports. Keep feeding them with tomato feed.
- 8. Water sweetcorn plants regularly and feed with tomato feed to get the best cobs.
- 9. Limit the number of squash fruits to 3 per plant, this gives better quality fruit.
- 10. Tidy up strawberry plants and remove old straw from around plants to prevent disease spread.

One of the healthiest was to gamble is with a spade and a packet of seeds.

"what next". Or perhaps you have children going to school in Salisbury and have spare room in a car?


English language teaching skills are in demand.
