Broadchalke Road speed limit – the saga continues..

In the last edition of STaB I reported that Wiltshire Council's consultants had recommended, on the basis of national criteria, against lowering the speed limit past the Play Area and the Pub from 40mph to 30mph. As a result the Parish Council wrote to Councillor Nick Holder, the Cabinet Member for Highways, requesting that he use the discretion the authority has under the national guidance to nevertheless recognise the particular hazards along that section of road and to make the change. He replied that he had put in place a review of the process:

"....we have set up an internal Task Group to scrutinise how the assessments are made and make recommendations on how it can be improved. Whilst this review is taking place, I am not intending to make any changes to the current recommendations. Once the process has concluded, I will be better placed to decide if I will intervene and make a different decision.

The intention is for the task group to produce the report and recommendations by the end of July. In the meantime I have asked the senior officers in the Highways Team to brief me on the issues in your two parish (Bishopstone and Broad Chalke) areas".

I will report further in due course!

Hemlock Water Dropwort

Once again this year there is growth of Hemlock Water Dropwort close to footpaths along the River Ebble. All parts of this plant are poisonous to both humans and animals and it should not be touched. It should not be confused with Cow Parsley. The Parish Council would urge walkers, and particularly those in charge of dogs, to take special care when passing these plants.

HWD is a perennial growing to over a metre high in and alongside streams, ditches and rivers. Unfortunately, it is very difficult to eradicate. Digging up and handling the roots presents a hazard to the operator and plant material must be carefully disposed of, ideally by burning. It can be killed with glyphosate based weed killers, but this has to be used before the plant comes into flower and a special licence has to be obtained from the Environment Agency for the use of such chemicals near watercourses.

Sharing the Roads

The Chalke Valley is, understandably, popular with cyclists. However, on occasion, dangerous situations can arise when cars are sharing the road with cyclists. The following guidance is helpful for drivers when encountering cyclists on the roads:

Cycle awareness: key messages for drivers

• Always look carefully for cyclists before: pulling out at a junction or roundabout; making any turning manoeuvre; or changing lanes in slower-moving/stationary traffic. Make it obvious that you have seen them (apparent inattention is confusing), and signal intentions clearly.

• Before turning out of one road into another, wait for any cyclist riding along the other road to pass. Do not turn out in front of them.

• Leave plenty of space when overtaking a cyclist, i.e. at least a car's width when overtaking at lower speeds (20-30 mph). Allow even more space: (a) when travelling at higher speeds; (b) when driving a lorry or other large vehicle; (c) in poor weather (rain makes it harder for cyclists to see potholes and reduces grip; and wind gusts can cause them to wobble); (d) on left-hand bends. Never cut in/ turn left sharply after overtaking a cyclist.

• Wait for a cyclist to ride through a pinch point / road narrowing before driving past, unless absolutely certain that there is enough room to overtake at a safe distance.

• Do not try to squeeze past oncoming cyclists if there is not enough room to do so safely.

• Drive at a considerate speed; do not accelerate or (without very good reason) brake rapidly around cyclists; or follow them impatiently/too closely ('tailgating' intimidates drivers too).

• Do not get impatient with cyclists who ride away from the kerb/parked cars. Cyclists are trained not to hug the kerb. This is because it increases their visibility and helps them avoid the risks of: (a) parked car doors opening on them; b) being overtaken where this would be dangerous; and (c) having to swerve towards the main traffic stream to avoid potholes.

• Look out for cyclists before opening a car door, and make sure passengers do too. Be aware that it is an offence to injure or endanger someone by opening a vehicle door, or even permit it.

• It is not compulsory for cyclists to use cycle tracks beside the road. All too many tracks are not properly designed/maintained, and/or may be obstructed. It is often better for cyclists (especially faster cyclists) to ride on the carriageway, both for their own and pedestrians' safety and comfort.

• Cyclists riding in groups are not required to keep in single file and often ride two abreast on narrow and winding lanes in the interests of safety. If they form a long, single-file line, drivers may try to overtake only to find that they are forced to pull in dangerously by oncoming vehicles. Riding two abreast is a way of deterring drivers from dangerous overtaking manoeuvres.

Notes from a Nutritionist by Amber Cotton Nutrition

As summer reaches its peak in July and August, many of us seek out lighter food that takes minimal preparation but that tastes delicious. My recipe this month is a classic dish that first found fame in the 1980s when it was published in 'The Silver Palate Cookbook' by Sheila Lukins and Julee Rosso. Chicken Marbella is created using chicken that has been first marinated in oil, vinegar, capers, olives, prunes and herbs, and then baked with brown sugar and white wine to create a delectable sweet and savoury flavour.

Chicken Marbella is a great dish for entertaining as it is easy to put together without a lot of hands-on cooking time and can be served both hot and at room temperature. I generally serve it with brown rice and a large green salad, but it works well with new potatoes, the herby couscous from June's recipe, or pasta.

Chicken thighs and drumsticks are commonly referred to as dark meat and are usually my preference when cooking most chicken dishes. Not only are they usually cheaper, they are higher in iron and zinc than the white meat, and also in vitamins B 6 and B12 which are important for energy production. Whilst they have a higher fat content than chicken breast meat, this fat includes healthy monosaturated and polyunsaturated fats that can aid in nutrient absorption, and also contributes to the richer flavour which can make your dish more satisfying.

Olives are a staple of the Mediterranean diet and offer numerous health benefits. They are high in monosaturated fats, particularly oleic acid, which is known for its beneficial effects on heart health, and they contain powerful antioxidants such as vitamin E which help to combat inflammation. Furthermore, consuming olives can increase your levels of good HDL cholesterol, while reducing levels of bad LDL cholesterol.

Prunes are often overlooked, but they are one of nature's powerhouses. They are an excellent source of dietary fibre which is essential for digestive health and contain a variety of vitamins and minerals including vitamins A and K, potassium and iron. Prunes are also a satisfying snack that can help to curb cravings for unhealthy foods but do be aware that prunes are high in sugar and also contain sorbitol, a natural laxative, so don't eat too many at once!

Capers are the small flower buds of the Capparis spinosa plant and are a flavourful addition to this dish. They are rich in nutrients and fibre, but also contain compounds that are thought to stimulate your body to produce natural digestive enzymes that will help you to break down protein and absorb nutrients from your food. They are also a good source of vitamin K, which is essential for bone health. Vitamin K helps your body to regulate your calcium levels and promotes the mineralisation of bone, so is important to help you reduce your risk of fractures and osteoporosis.

Finally, be liberal with herbs, not just on this dish but on anything you cook. They are not just flavour enhancers but also powerful natural remedies with numerous health benefits. A good handful of fresh herbs counts as one of your 5-a-day, will add extra plant diversity to your diet to support your gut microbiome, and they are a potent source of vitamins, minerals, antioxidants, and bioactive compounds that support your overall health and well-being.

Chicken Marbella

Serves 6-8

Ingredients

8 large chicken legs or thighs (bone-in)

4-5 cloves of garlic, crushed

2 tbsp dried oregano

Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

4 tbsp red wine vinegar

4 tbsp extra virgin olive oil

50 g pitted prunes

8 large pitted green olives, cut in half

25 g capers with a little juice

3 bay leaves

50 g brown sugar

120 ml white wine

2 tbsp flat-leaf parsley, finely chopped or sprigs of rosemary to serve

Method

1. In a large bowl combine garlic, oregano, salt and pepper to taste, vinegar, olive oil, prunes, olives, capers with juice, and bay leaves. Add the chicken pieces and coat completely with the marinade. Cover and leave to marinate in the refrigerator for at least 2-3 hours or overnight.

2. When ready to cook, preheat the oven to 180C.

3. Arrange the chicken in a single layer in one or two large shallow baking trays and evenly spoon the marinade over the pieces. Sprinkle brown sugar over the chicken and pour the white wine around them.

4. Bake for 50-60 minutes, basting frequently with the pan juices. The chicken is cooked when a sharp knife inserted into the pieces at their thickest point runs with clear juices.

5. With a slotted spoon, move the chicken, prunes, olives and capers to a serving dish. Poor some of the pan juices over the chicken and sprinkle generously with parsley.

Serve the remaining juices in a jug on the side.

Police Bulletin

A monthly newsletter from Philip Wilkinson, Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire.



The issue of rural crime in Wiltshire and its links to larger organised crime groups, is something people from across the county have been raising with me ever since I first took up the post as Police and Crime Commissioner in 2021.

Whilst improvements have been made in Wiltshire in terms of the size of the rural crime team and their equipment, we are still in the midst of making the necessary changes to improve our regional intelligence gathering and sharing capabilities across the south-west.

Recently, I led a discussion at Wiltshire's first ever Rural Crime Forum in Tidworth, where over one hundred delegates from rural communities and farms, as well as representatives from organisations such as National Farmers' Union, the Landowners' Association, the Angling Trust and Heritage England, shared with me the concerns they have regarding crime.

It's clear to me from these discussions, that we need to make it easier for people to report crime and be better at letting them know how these cases are progressing once they have been reported. These are issues I have raised with the senior leadership team at Wiltshire Police, and I will continue to support them until we find a satisfactory solution.

At the forum, there were presentations from Dr Kate Tudor, a senior criminologist, where she explained how organised crime groups are involved in rural crime; and from Superintendent Doug Downing, who showed how a collaborative and intelligence-led operation across the south-west called Ragwort is working to robustly combat these groups.

Tacking rural crime will be a priority in my Police and Crime Plan for 2025-29.

From July 5th, after the general election, I'll be asking you for your thoughts on where you think Wiltshire Police should be focussing our resources to make Wiltshire and Swindon safer and those priorities will be highlighted in my Police and Crime Plan.
