Hello from the Revd Ruth Howlett Shipley



‘Are we there yet???’ ‘How many more sleeps before Christmas?’ ‘When are we going on holiday?’

How many times have we asked questions like these? If you are anything like me, you may not like having to wait for things; we live in a world that seems to want everything to happen instantly.

At this time of year there seems to be a lot of waiting. My daughter has just finished her A Level exams and, like young people up and down the country, she is now waiting anxiously for the results and wondering whether her results be good enough for her choice of university.

Or maybe you are waiting for the end of term to come? Children are excited about the prospect of the long holiday away from school, but I am sure some parents are more worried about how they are going to juggle childcare and work. Last week the year 6 children from our schools went to Salisbury Cathedral for the Leavers Service and are looking forward to starting at their new schools in September; some are waiting excitedly for this new phase of their lives but for others there may well be anxiety about this next step.

Maybe you are waiting to a much anticipated holiday? Or maybe you are waiting for medical test results or treatment to start. For some the waiting is filled with excitement but for others it may be dominated by anxiety.

Farmers are waiting for the harvest and they too will be waiting with mixed emotions. Will the weather bring the right conditions at the right time to produce a bumper crop or does the weather forecast make them anxious?

In the Church’s year we have just celebrated Pentecost when the disciples were filled by the Holy Spirit and excitedly told all those around them about what had happened. There had been a lot of waiting in the fifty days since Easter and the disciples had certainly experienced both highs and lows. Waiting in the upper room after Good Friday the anxious disciples tried to understand what had happened over the last few days in Jerusalem. How were they going to manage now that Jesus had gone away? Then they encountered the resurrected Jesus and found hope.

But once again on Ascension Day Jesus left them and told them to stay in Jerusalem and wait. They waited and prayed for the Holy Spirit to come and equip them for the mission that Jesus had set for them. And when the Spirit came, accompanied by wind and fire at Pentecost they were excited; this was what they had been waiting for!

The outcome of our waiting may not be accompanied by wind and fire, but whatever you are waiting for at this time I pray that the waiting won’t be too difficult or provoke to much anxiety but instead will bring excitement and joy.

Bishopstone Village Hall rates for private hire

Bishopstone Village Hall has 2 rooms that are available for hire for a wide range of functions. The larger room is ideal for children's parties with lots of space for running around. It can also accommodate wedding receptions, charity functions and large family celebrations.

The smaller room (The Memorial Room) is a good size for meetings and smaller gatherings.

The modern kitchen is spacious and fully equipped with an electric catering range, a professional 4 minute dishwasher, water boiler, hot cupboard, microwave oven, 2 fridges and a freezer, all suitable for professional caterers. There is also glassware, crockery and cutlery for over 80 people.

The hire charges include use of heating and electricity.

An additional charge is made for use of the broadband connection of £6 per hour with a maximum of £25 per day.

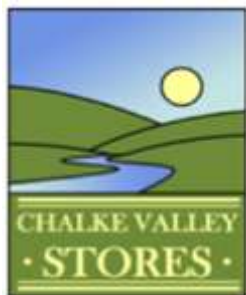

HERITAGE LOTTERY FUND BID FOR THE REPAIR TO THE ROOF OF THE NORTH TRANSEPT OF OUR CHURCH

Last month we alluded to the need to meet the four Key Investment Principles of the Heritage Lottery Fund - Heritage, Environment, Inclusion and Participation and Organisational Stability.

In our bid submission we need to highlight these principles and demonstrate our ability and intention to meet them. This will be done by having actions and intentions that fit these principles as well as some defined timescale associated with them. Key to understand is that any actions or intentions do not have to be completed before we submit our bid – thank goodness! Rather we need to demonstrate an intended action and its deadline over several years.

This has resulted in some positive ideas. Some examples:

A Nature Survey of the churchyard (Environment). By the time you read this that survey will have been completed, and detail will be able to be included in our bid documentation.

A Children's Guide to the Church. (Inclusion and Participation). An excellent trifold guide for young people was produced for St Mary & St Lawrence in Stratford Tony in 2016 by Years 5 & 6 at Coombe Bissett School. We hope this exercise can be repeated for our church in 2026.

Tap and Pay. (Organisational Stability). Visitors to the church will be able to donate using this newly installed system bringing additional funding to the church.

Meanwhile our architect is about to go to tender for the repair work to be done.

One additional headache is now the need for an Asbestos Survey!

Wildfire Information

If British Summer Time and warmer days mean you will be visiting one of Dorset and Wiltshire's local heathlands or outdoors spaces to enjoy the wildlife and wilderness, please take a picnic.

Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service (DWFRS) is encouraging residents and visitors to bring a picnic and not a barbecue when out and about. Warmer and breezy weather increases the risk of accidental or deliberate fires in our open spaces.

A wildfire can move at speeds faster than an Olympic sprinter, so we are asking everyone to follow some simple steps:

- If you are enjoying our open spaces when a fire occurs, get to a safe place and call the fire service on 999 immediately, with as much information as possible.
- Consider downloading and using What3Words to identify your exact location.
- You can also help by reporting any anti-social behaviour on our heaths and open spaces to the Police on 101.

Landowners and land managers are also advised, where possible, to be prepared for fires and ensure that fire breaks are cut and well maintained with any cut grasses and vegetation removed from the site.

From the national newspaper archives this month: a tale with a happy outcome and three less so.

SEARCH FOR MISSING GIRL.
WAITED ON A KENT PLATFORM FOR
"THE TRAIN TO LONDON."

Anxious inquiries are being made concerning a girl who left her employment at Wrotham, Kent, on September 18, and has not been traced since seen sitting on the platform at Wrotham the same day "waiting for the London train."

She is Bessie Strick, daughter of Mrs. Strick, of Manor Farm, Bishopstone, Salisbury, and her mother implored the West London magistrate on Saturday to help her in the search.

The official description of the missing girl is as follows:—

Age 15½ years; height 5ft. 6½in.; stout build; eyes hazel; hair and complexion very fair; scar over right eye caused by recent cycle accident.

Last seen wearing brown coat and skirt, with round, gun-metal buttons; fawn hat; new black shoes and stockings. Carried a yellow suede bag, trench coat, and an umbrella.

In September 1920 the national press – the Daily Express and the London Daily Chronicle – both featured the story of a young girl (15 yrs) missing from her employer in Kent, much to the distress of her mother who lived at Manor Farm, Bishopstone.

MOTHER'S GRATITUDE.
LOST GIRL FOUND THROUGH THE
"DAILY EXPRESS."

Bessie Hosken Strick, the fifteen-year-old girl who vanished from her employer's house in Kent, has been found, thanks to the publicity of the "Daily Express."

Her mother, Mrs. Ena Strick, writes from Manor Farm, Bishopstone, near Salisbury, Wilts:—

"I wish to thank you for all your trouble, kindness, and assistance in tracing my daughter, Bessie Strick, who had been missing from Greenbeech, Wrotham, Kent, since September 18.

"I am pleased to be able to tell you my daughter was found on Wednesday at Pewsey, in North Wilts.

She was found through a man working on the road, who had seen the description in your paper."

Young Bessie Strick was found in Pewsey by a man "working on the road" who had seen her description in the Daily Express. There was no explanation of how she came to be there.

A reminder of the past dangers of farming comes from these rather gruesome reports. The first is from The Wilts Independent of September 1840 and the second from the Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette of June 1898.

A SHEPHERD KILLED BY
LIGHTNING
IN SOUTH WILTS.
SINGULAR PRESENTIMENT OF DEATH.

A labourer named Scott was killed by lightning at Bishopstone, near Salisbury, during the terrible thunderstorm in that district on Tuesday week. He was found lying dead under a tree, to which he had no doubt gone for shelter, regardless of the risk he was running. The electric fluid had left a mark forming a ring round his neck, and his leggings were ripped open. Twelve sheep were also killed. The poor man had a presentiment that he would lose his life in this way. Some years ago while driving some sheep four of them were killed, and he had been heard to say he would himself some day be killed by lightning.

A respectable farmer, named Good, at Bishopstone, near Salisbury, met with a deplorable accident a few days since, whilst superintending a thrashing-machine at work on his farm. Some of the machinery caught an outer garment, and dragged him over the wheels, by which his back was broken, and he sustained other severe injuries. The unfortunate man lingered several days after the accident, before death terminated his sufferings.—Wilts Independent.

The third is from the Salisbury Times of August 1901 – any comment on the poor young man's name would be beneath the editorial standards of this magazine!

Summer Rambling with Jazzie

Our roses are beginning to bloom now, and the hollyhocks are also starting. Happily the rains have filled the water butts so we have plenty for the veggies. We have just planted about 8 dahlias after nurturing them from our own very old corms. Our orange bush and the bougainvillea are thriving and growing well. They came from the stand outside LIDL earlier this year, at about £6 each and have doubled in size, with tiny oranges growing too! Doesn't the garden give you so much fun, and even joy!

Otherwise, we have started to strip down an old armchair, possibly over two hundred years old. Many repairs to the frame are to be completed, including rebuilding a leg and reinforcing all the joints. The original stuffing, of horsehair and straw, has all been disposed of quickly, before anyone/thing can escape into the house! During the operation, I have been rewarded by £6.40 in loose change, found in the sides of the chair, probably lost by my old man!



We look forward to more hot weather with some rain for the lawns and veggies and the fruit. We can then go walkies with more comfort than now, and perhaps think about a late summer hol in France again. We are also looking forward to a day at the Chalke History Fest and hope for good weather, good food and excellent talks once again.

Police Bulletin

In recent years, my office has worked hard to improve transparency and engagement between the police and the public and I've always been an advocate for better informed communities.

That's why I want to highlight some key tools available on both the OPCC and Wiltshire Police websites, starting with the 'Your Area' section of the Wiltshire Police homepage.

This platform allows you to input your postcode and acts as a window into your neighbourhood's policing activity by showing up to date local crime stats, so you can see what's happening in your community—from burglary to antisocial behaviour—and how trends are changing.

We know that a visible police presence matters to communities, and my office has recently invested in two new mobile police stations to make policing services more accessible, even in the most rural of areas.

You will soon be able to find upcoming dates and locations of these mobile police stations, as well as a list of police station opening times and your Neighbourhood Policing Team officers.

Another useful digital tool is the Street Safe page. This is a service that allows you to report safety concerns in public places anonymously, including issues like poorly lit streets, abandoned buildings, or vandalism, as well as instances where you feel unsafe due to someone following or verbally abusing you.

On the OPCC website you can find my latest Police and Crime Plan which was developed after an in-depth public consultation period with the public, local stakeholders, and policing professionals with both local, regional and national input. It outlines the main priorities for the force up until 2029, which is also helpful to keep up to date with areas of focus.

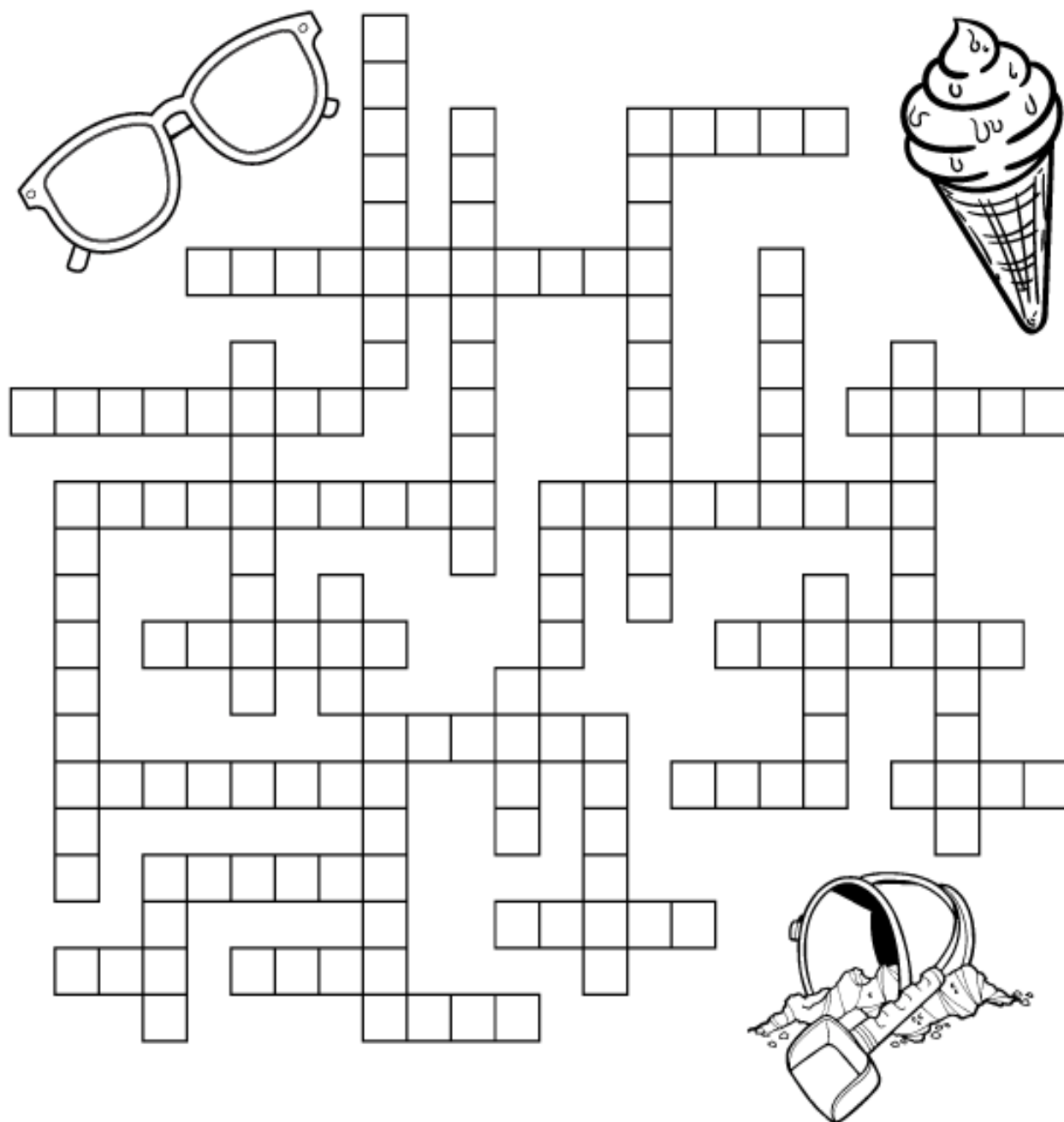
Delivery against the Police and Crime Plan is recorded quarterly in Highlight and Performance reports which are also published on the OPCC website as well as presented to the Police and Crime Panel.

I encourage all residents to explore these various tools and webpages, bookmark them, and use them to stay informed and engaged with policing in your communities.

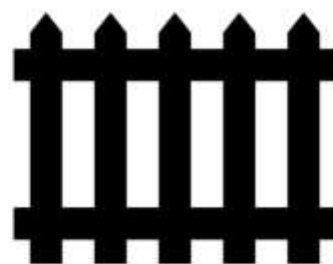

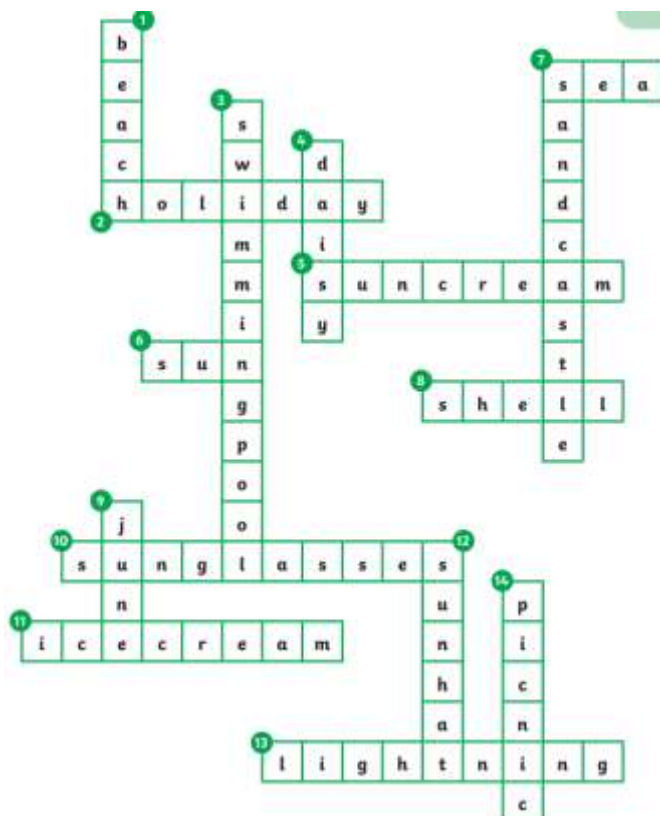
