Bishopstone Village Hall has 2 rooms that are available for hire for a wide range of functions. The larger room is ideal for children's parties with lots of space for running around. It can also accommodate wedding receptions, charity functions and large family celebrations.

The smaller room (The Memorial Room) is a good size for meetings and smaller gatherings.

The modern kitchen is spacious and fully equipped with an electric catering range, a professional 4 minute dishwasher, water boiler, hot cupboard, microwave oven, 2 fridges and a freezer, all suitable for professional caterers. There is also glassware, crockery and cutlery for over 80 people.

The hire charges include use of heating and electricity.

Facilities for all the Chalke Valley SPORTS SCENE MAY 2024

Multi Use Games Area resurfacing. The contractor has now been appointed and work is anticipated to start in the late summer. Total cost is £25,000 and work on putting in place the final funding is taking place with two grant applications submitted. There has been careful thought and investigation into the most suitable surfacing for our needs. As a multi sports venue, porous macadam provides the best flexibility and within the costs that we can fund. This will have a two-tone acrylic colour finish. We were successful last year in raising funds to replace the floodlights with energy efficient units, so the area can be used all year around, and save money.

Kitchen Upgrade. Great news. We have received further grant funding from Empower who have now contributed £3,000 bringing total grant support to over £4,500. We have also been successful in receiving a donation of a double range oven and extract fan from Howden's Salisbury and we are very grateful for their support to the project. Howden's are based on Churchfields industrial estate and supply kitchens and work surfaces to the trade.


We are also always looking for volunteers to help in the operation of the sports centre. Please contact one of the committee members.

Securing our Church



At this year's Annual Parish Meeting, Sarah Seal, Churchwarden of our village church, St John the Baptist, gave a report on the activities of the church community in 2023.

Without the same threat from Covid, the Church was finally able to hold its regular services and welcome people in the usual way. The annual Carol Service was held in the Village Hall again, which allowed many more people to attend and nearly 90 people were welcomed to the ever popular Carols round the Crib on Christmas Eve. In the Summer we were able to resume holding a Choral Evensong in Stratford Tony Church and at Christmas we held our first carol service there, with the congregation being ferried back and forth by cars capable of getting through the flood water.

Thanks to the Committee of the Friends of Bishopstone Church, a lot of work was completed on the church building. Repairs were made to some of the stonework and a start was made to wash down and remove four layers of distemper on the interior nave walls before repainting in 2024. New hand rails were also installed at the entrance to the porch, a gift from Hester Kirkham.

Two things in the churchyard happened last year, which placed an extra financial burden on the church. After a storm, a large branch from the churchyard beech tree fell onto the thatched wall on the opposite side of the road, causing damage. Because of our concern that further storm damage might endanger people passing by, bring down power and telephone cables or seriously damage the church and gravestones, the tree was surveyed. As a result, the tree canopy was reduced, and dead branches removed. The cost of which was over £1500.

We also enrolled in a Church of England scheme to have the churchyard surveyed. At no cost to us, it will record where all the burials are located, details of all memorials and church records and provide an accurate plan of the churchyard, forming an online record that the public can access. Partly in preparation for the survey but also to improve access to graves for families and visitors, a party of volunteers has begun clearing overgrown areas which in turn revealed the need for levelling with a digger and repairs to the walls at further expense. An additional grant from the Parish Council helped to meet these unexpected costs.

The maintenance of the church building and the churchyard could not happen without the ongoing financial support of the Friends of Bishopstone Church and the Parish Council. However, the resources needed to ensure that our church is alive, providing a welcome to all in our community when they need it, relies upon the generosity of people providing such things as flowers to decorate the church, coffee and biscuits after services, the mulled wine etc after the carol services, cleaning

products, or time and energy for hedge cutting etc, in addition to financial support.

In 2023 it cost around £600 a week to keep our church going. This covered our contribution to the Diocese for the costs of our clergy, benefice costs, heating, lighting, insurance, organists and general bills. At the end of the year our expenditure exceeded our income by about £1,309. Costs will rise in 2024.

Our only sources of income are from people who give a regular amount to the church, church collections at services, occasional fundraising events and a portion of the fees from weddings, funerals, and christenings. At the Parish Meeting it was suggested that more fundraising events could be organised. These could be a welcome source of income but would rely, perhaps, upon the same volunteers to organise them, might detract from Village Hall activities and would not provide a guaranteed stream of income to enable the Parochial Church Council and our Treasurer to plan ahead with balanced books.

A number of families in our community have currently committed to giving on a monthly basis. A few make an annual donation. If others were to join them, in addition to preserving a beautiful building, we will be able to secure the future of a living church for its regular services and those special occasions when families come together – our christenings, weddings and funerals.



The High Sheriff of Wiltshire

Founder of Horatio's Garden charity and Bishopstone resident, Olivia Chapple has been appointed to the role of High Sheriff of Wiltshire. This is an independent and non-political, voluntary position appointed by the monarchy for one year.

As High Sheriff, Olivia is the King's representative in the county for the Judiciary and emergency services. In the role, she will also be actively supporting the voluntary sector across all the diverse communities of Wiltshire.

Olivia's Declaration ceremony and celebration was held at St John the Baptist Church on 5th April officiated by The Revd Canon Jenny Taylor who is Olivia's Chaplain for the year of office. The church wardens and many, very kind local people were



brilliant in their support of the occasion, especially all those who helped with parking, as rain meant that the field could not be used! Amazingly there was a break in the weather as guests arrived and everyone was truly bowled over by the beauty of our church.

The ceremony saw a packed church of local dignitaries and community leaders from across the county, alongside local friends and family. The ceremonial procession included the Lord-Lieutenant Mrs Sarah Troughton, Chief Fire Officer Mr Ben Ansell, Chief Constable, Ms Catherine Roper, the Police and Crime Commissioner, Mr Philip Wilkinson, OBE and former Mayors of Salisbury Tom and Caroline Corbin. The Honourable Mrs Justice Judd officiated and witnessed the Declaration.



The multifaith service was led by Revd Canon Jenny Taylor, with prayers given by the Chief Priest at Swindon Hindu Temple Prasad Karamchedu, Peter Beyfus representative of the Jewish Community of Wiltshire and Maulana Mahmudul Hasan Maruf, Imam of Salisbury Central Mosque.



The music included a world premier performance of Shantiniketan (Haven of Peace), a hymn for interfaith unity, cultural pluralism and racial justice written by *Anita Datta* and published by Multitude of Voyces inclusive hymn project.

The declaration ceremony was also attended by former High Sheriff's including outgoing Sheriff, Pradeep Bhardwaj, the Marchioness of Lansdowne, Sir Charles Hobhouse and Major General Ashley Truluck as well as Vice Lord-Lieutenant Sir Andrew Gregory. Ambassadors and supporters of Horatio's Garden, including the Countess of Radnor, Annie Maw CVO CStJ, Andrew Widdowson and former patient Charlie West also attended.

Echoing her intention to support charities working to connect people with nature, Olivia's ceremonial outfit featured feathers donated by Fergus, the Great Bustard, responsible for the reintroduction of bustards to Salisbury Plain by the Great Bustard Group.



Fergus!

The Great Bustard is an iconic bird for Wiltshire, appearing on the county coat of arms, its crest, and as the symbol of the High Sheriff. During the 19th century, Great Bustards were hunted to extinction, but since 1998, The Great Bustard Group has worked to restore the Great Bustard in the UK. There is now a population of over 100 Great Bustards and they are breeding at a level to be self-sufficient.

Notes from a Nutritionist by Amber Cotton Nutrition

My recipe this month is an adaption of a salad from the "Leon Happy Salads" book by Jane Baxter and John Vincent. This Paella Deli Salad is delicious dish that everyone can dive into - it also has the added benefit of being gluten and dairy free so you can serve it up when you might have guests who have dietary restrictions, and you don't want to cook two separate meals. The ingredients list for this recipe is quite long, but don't be put off - with a little preparation beforehand, it really doesn't take that long to make it.

As this salad is based on paella, rice is the key ingredient, and as with many Spanish dishes it is flavoured with saffron. Saffron is the most expensive spice in the world, and the reason for this is its labour-intensive harvesting method from the *Crocus sativus* flower. Saffron has been revered for centuries for its impressive health benefits including being a powerful antioxidant that protects cells against damage from free radicals, helping to improve mood, reducing PMS symptoms such as headaches, cravings and anxiety, and acting as an aphrodisiac! Saffron has a subtle taste and aroma which makes it easy to add to your food. Soak it in some hot water before using to give it a deeper flavour.

Prawns are another common ingredient in paella dishes though you could easily substitute them here for cooked squid rings, mussels, fish, chickpeas or firm tofu. They are one of the most commonly consumed types of shellfish and are highly nutritious. Prawns are low in calories, high in protein and healthy omega-3 fats, as well as containing a variety of vitamins and minerals including iodine (which you need for good thyroid health).

When I made this for lunch today I used chorizo as I had some in the fridge, but some leftover cooked chicken would also be a good alternative. Otherwise use any of the substitutions above and play around with quantities depending on what you have available. I also added lots of veg (more than the recipe states) - green peas, asparagus, half a jar of artichoke hearts, green beans, chopped peppers, spinach leaves, a few chopped sundried tomatoes, some left-over cooked broccoli spears, olives and herbs – as I did a bit of a fridge raid and added whatever needed using up.

Green peas are always a great addition to dishes as they are little nutritional power-houses. A single 80g portion of green peas contains 4.5g of fibre and 4.3g of protein, as well as containing over 10% of both your daily folate (vitamin B9) and vitamin C needs. In fact, green peas are one of the best plant-based sources of protein, which is a major reason why they are so filling.

Finally I topped my salad with lots of wild rocket. Rocket is a bitter-tasting salad leaf that is brilliant at supporting healthy digestion. As soon as the bitter flavour hits your tongue, a signal is sent to your entire digestive tract to start producing digestive juices to help break down your food, including bile that helps you to digest fats. In fact some people find that starting their meals with a small bitter-leaf salad is all it takes to alleviate their symptoms of bloating, heartburn and indigestion. Rocket is a nutrient-dense food that, like green peas, is high fibre, low in sugar, and contains several vital nutrients including calcium, potassium, folate, and vitamins A, C and K. Eat it freely, drizzled with a little olive oil, whenever you get the opportunity.

Recipe of the Month - Leon's Paella Deli Salad

Salad:

A pinch of saffron

250g long-grain rice

1 tbsp olive oil

1 onion, finely chopped

1 tsp smoked paprika (add more if you like a pronounced flavour)

350ml gluten-free chicken stock

100g cured chorizo (not cooking chorizo)

100g artichoke hearts, sliced

200g prawns

150g peas, briefly cooked

150g French beans, cooked

100g piquillo pepper strips, rinse before slicing

1 orange, cut into slices

2 tbsp chopped flat-leaf parsley

4 large handfuls of rocket leaves

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

Dressing:

1 teaspoon of sweet paprika

Grated zest of 1 orange

1 clove of garlic, crushed

1 tbsp of red wine vinegar

3 tablespoons of olive oil

1 tsp of honey or maple syrup (optional)

METHOD

Soak the saffron in 50ml of very hot water for 5 minutes or more. Rinse the rice well with cold water, the leave it, covered in water, to soak for 30 minutes. Drain well.

Heat 1 tbsp of olive oil in a large pan and cook the onion gently for 5 minutes. Tip in the drained rice with the smoked paprika and cook for a minute. Season with salt and pepper and stir well to coat the rice with oil. Add the soaked saffron and chicken stock and bring to a simmer. Cover, then allow to cook on a low heat for about 15 minutes until all the liquid has been absorbed. Leave to stand for 5 minutes before fluffing up with a fork. Tip out of the pan and leave to cool to room temperature.

While the rice is cooking, whisk together the dressing ingredients and season. Prepare all the other ingredients for the salad.

Layer your ingredients up on a large serving dish or plate, seasoning as you go. Scatter the rice over the plate, then top with the other ingredients, finishing with the orange slices, parsley and rocket leaves. Drizzle with the dressing and serve.

Police Bulletin

A monthly newsletter from Philip Wilkinson, Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire.



I was astonished to learn recently that those criminal gangs who groom and exploit children and young people to carry out criminal activities on their behalf are now using virtual rewards to take advantage of them.

This takes the form of credit in online video games, so no longer must parents only be on the look out for new trainers, designer clothes and expensive technology if they're worried their child is being exploited, but also online enticements such as avatars and virtual currency.

Children and young people are especially vulnerable to being exploited by criminal gangs because of their age and the harm caused to themselves, their families and their communities can be devastating with violent incidents often escalating.

That's why my office has backed the 'Check Your Children' campaign developed by Owen's World, a charity set up by family and friends following the death of Owen Dunn who was fatally stabbed in Swindon in December 2022.

Owen was carrying a knife at the time of the stabbing, and now his family are asking parents and guardians to look out for any signs that their children may be involved in knife or gang crime.

We've developed a video to explain the signs of exploitation, the reality of serious violence in Wiltshire and where they can seek further guidance and advice if they're concerned.

We often think of drug and knife crime happening in our city and bigger towns, but our villages and more rural areas are not immune from the threat of county lines and serious violence, and sadly nor are the children and young people that live there.

So, my plea to parents, guardians, grandparents, and other caregivers, please 'Check your Children' don't shy away from asking the difficult questions of your children and seeking support from schools, police, Crimestoppers and the NSPCC if you need it.
