The Annual Parish Meeting and the meeting of the Parish Council, postponed from March, will take place on **Thursday 12th May 2022 starting at 7.00pm in the Village Hall**. The Annual Parish Meeting is an opportunity for anyone living in the village to raise local issues of current interest for discussion. As in previous years this APM will include reports by village organisations on their activities in 2021 and on current projects affecting the village.

Notices about the Parish Council meeting, including the agenda, will be posted on the village noticeboards and on the village website. This will be the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council with the election of the Chairman and Vice Chairman.

No, it wasn't an April Fools prank! I did say in April's STAB that the new, updated, village website would go live on Friday 1st April, "subject to any last-minute technical hitches". Bishopstone Village Hall rates for private hire

Bishopstone Village Hall has 2 rooms that are available for hire for a wide range of functions. The larger room is ideal for children's parties with lots of space for running around. It can also accommodate wedding receptions, charity functions and large family celebrations.

The smaller room (The Memorial Room) is a good size for meetings and smaller gatherings.

The modern kitchen is spacious and fully equipped with an electric catering range, a professional 4 minute dishwasher, water boiler, hot cupboard, microwave oven, 2 fridges and a freezer, all suitable for professional caterers. There is also glassware, crockery and cutlery for over 80 people.

The hire charges include use of heating and electricity.

Bishopstone Ultrafast Broadband Update - May 2022

As you may be aware from articles in the press, the UK move to full fibre to the property (FTTP) broadband and related VoIP style connectivity for home phones has one irritating drawback over the old analogue copper phone services - **if your house suffers a power cut then your landline phone services will stop working.**

This needs to be considered carefully. **Under Openreach's current plan the traditional analogue services on their national copper line network was due to gradually reduce after December 2025 as part of a phased withdrawal of that network**. This was mentioned in last month's report in STaB. However, at the moment there is the possibility that this may be delayed as the blinding glimpse of the obvious seems to have taken Openreach by surprise!

On the plus side, the new technology is designed to work alongside other technology, such as artificially intelligent anti-fraud measures for the elderly.

The change, which has already happened in other countries (Australia, Canada and Sweden), will occur as networks move to an increasingly digital service. One often overlooked advantage of the old copper telephone network is that it is powered (50 volts) via the network **from the exchange**. This meant that you would be able to make a phone call during a home or local power cut.

There are other considerations:

If you have an old analogue phone (See right) **this will work if there is a power outage** as its supply, <u>at the moment, comes via copper wire</u> from the exchange in Broadchalke to the western side of the village. However,

there are possibly very few of these types of phones in use today.

Most home nowadays have multi-station phones with the ability to record incoming calls if you are not around. (See left). If there is a power outage this type of phone **will not work**. Just try switching of the power supply to this type of device's base station if you have one.

Several years ago, as part of the Bishopstone Emergency Plan, we recommended that vulnerable people should purchase a backup analogue phone (See right) if they were normally dependent on a multi-station phone. (This recommendation was made just after the severe flooding of 2013-14. This type of phone will work if there is a power outage at the moment but once the copper line service ceases to operate sometime after 2025 as explained above **this type of phone will also cease to work in the event of a power outage**.

So what are the alternatives?

1. First and foremost we do not suffer many lengthy power outages. Such incidents in the recent past have been due to a swan flying into the local overhead power lines and a faulty power line. We have not, to the best of our knowledge, had power outages due to power cables being damaged by storms nor have we experienced extended outages of several days. Some time ago servicing work was done on a local transformer and on that occasion SSE provided a generator truck to provide continuous power while the work was done.







2. Many people nowadays are moving away from using their house phone for calls, especially long-distance calls, due the the rates charged. The alternative is to use a mobile phone for most conversations as it is much, much cheaper.

3. If there is a power outage then normal home chargers for mobile phones will not work. There is also a likely-hood that our local mobile phone mast will lose power as well, though it does have back-up battery power for a few hours.

These matters will be of prime concern to the vulnerable and there are some solutions but it is important to realise this change from copper is not due to begin until <u>at least</u> 2025. We will be offering some further detail next month. In the meantime, consider the following possible options.

- Keep your mobile phone charged and with you, especially in the event of severe weather warnings or incidents.
- Ensure that you can charge your mobile how?
 - Battery pack- to be covered in next month's STaB
 - Charge in your car
- Vulnerable people <u>may</u> be able to get free battery packs. (Detail to come next month)
- Vulnerable people <u>may</u> be able to get free mobile emergency phones. (Detail on these so-called dumb phones will again come in next month's article).

What is important to realise is that irrespective of opting or not opting to increase your broadband speed via Fibre to the Premises (FTTP) and our village Rural Gigabit Voucher Scheme (RGVS) it is the decision by Openreach for the gradual withdrawal of the copper line service across the whole of the UK sometime after 2025 that is the issue.

It is also important to realise that the copper wire will stay connected to your house. It is the main cabling along roads and underground that will eventually be recovered for scrap.

Project Update.

As at the time of writing this note (18 April 22) Openreach have been back in the village working on the underground links to a few properties that had been highlighted during the previous visits by engineers in January. They have also been laying new conduits (plastic tubing) to some houses that had the existing copper cabling just buried in the ground. We have no further news on the start date for the full project but remain hopeful that it will be soon.

So, keep walking and gardening as summer comes along. Don't forget to enjoy the Platinum Jubilee weekend in the village.

In Our Night Sky - Uranus

From time immemorial there had been only 6 known planets. Then a German musician and composer William Herschel came along. He was initially brought over as a member of a band by George II. After the defeat of Hanover, where George II actually fought in the field against the French, William moved permanently to England, soon after joined by his sister who later assisted in his work, later making discoveries and contributions of her own lasting to this day. An amateur astronomer, he built his own telescopes improving on Newton's reflecting design, spending months polishing the curved metal bowls, his best was 6m across.

His discovery of Uranus in 1781 doubled the size of the known Solar System. Until recent years it was seen as an almost featureless blue disc, but enigmatic as it is the only planet with its equator perpendicular to its plane of rotation, and where did its magnetic field come from?

Uranus is the inner of the now called (water) Ice Giants with an apt blue colour. Modern observations have shown a small rocky core, surrounded by water and ammonia ices with some methane, making up 80% of the planet's mass. The upper third is liquid, but more interestingly the inner material is thought to be superionic, with a temperature at the core of 5,000 deg.C. Water at extreme temperatures and pressures allows H+ ions in effect to move rapidly and generate high conductivity, which with movement generates a magnetic field, which again is unusual being 60 deg. away from its axis of rotation.

The atmosphere, which gradually merges with the outer core, is primarily hydrogen with helium and 2% methane, which gives the blue colour.

Herschel did note that there may be a red ring around the planet, but no-one else could find rings until 1977 (200 years later) and the red ring was confirmed. In 1800 during studies on the components of light using a prism he discovered infra-red. The explanation of electromagnetic radiation would later be set forth by James

Clerk Maxwell in 1861, whose calculation of the speed of light would prompt Einstein to his great theory.

Recipe of the Month - Watercress Mashed Potato

How lucky we are to be able to buy fresh watercress in Broadchalke from the beds where it is grown, a mere few miles from our village! We are always looking for new ways to use it. Try this simple recipe to incorporate it into mashed potato.

This would be perfect served with pan-fried salmon, or steak.

Leftovers are delicious mixed with tinned fish, formed into fishcakes, coated in breadcrumbs and fried until brown.

Ingredients

650g floury potato, cut into chunks100ml milk25g butter170g bag watercress, roughly chopped3 spring onions, finely chopped (optional)

Method

Cook the potatoes in a large pan of salted water for 15 mins or until tender. Drain well, then return to the pan to steam-dry for a few mins before mashing.

Push the potatoes to one side and add the milk and butter to the other side of the pan. Heat gently until the butter melts, then stir into the potatoes with the watercress and spring onions (if using) and some salt and pepper to taste.



Sarah's Gardening Tips for May

- 1. Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of daffodils and other spring bulbs.
- 2. Remember to open greenhouse doors and vents on warm days.
- 3. Check containers daily for moisture levels as they dry our much quicker than borders. You can add water retaining granules.
- 4. Put in plant supports before plants start to flop over.
- 5. Plant summer hanging baskets, adding good quality compost and feed granules to keep plants in good condition.
- 6. Check the lawn for weeds and dig out.
- 7. Sow herb seeds outdoors or in pots on a window sill.
- 8. Earth up potato plants to protect from frost and encourage a bigger crop.
- 9. Check for nesting birds before clipping hedges.
