

Parish Council

A meeting of Bishopstone Parish Council took place on Tuesday 21st July using Zoom Video Conferencing. Roger Stockton, Emergency Planning Officer, and Kate Pendleton also joined the meeting.

The main item for discussion was whether to re-open the Children's Play Area on the Recreation Field given the Government's relaxation of the Covid 19 restrictions. Consideration was given to a Risk Assessment that had been prepared. It was pointed out that the village had been relatively successful in avoiding Covid 19 infection. The risk of Covid 19 infection remained and a "safety first" approach should be followed. The Parish Council could not directly manage the use made of the play area or undertake sanitizing of the equipment. However, the Government's guidance was that play areas could now re-open and those in Salisbury and other parishes were now available. There was a danger that if our play area is not open children would be taken to those that were, with a wider risk of infection transfer. Many children had been adversely affected by the lock down and it was desirable to re-open the play area if at all possible. The play area is almost exclusively used by children from within the village and parents and carers should be asked to ensure that social distancing and hygiene rules are followed.

Following a wide-ranging debate it was decided that the play area should re-open subject to it being clear that responsibility for maintaining social distancing and hygiene rests with parents/carers and not the Parish Council. When re-opened notices will be erected on the site as follows on the next page.

A thorough risk-assessment was carried out before making this decision. Arrangements were also agreed for closing the play area again should evidence emerge that the guidelines are not being followed, or if local infection rates change.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is due to be held on 3rd September. It is probable that meetings will continue to be held remotely for the time being.

The village owes a great debt of gratitude to Michael Pratt who set up and ran the incredibly valuable Prescription Collection Service at the beginning of lockdown. He managed a huge number of prescription requests with great efficiency, and he had his wife Pippa often took on a driving role in order to collect emergency or last-minute requests. Many thanks from us all.

USE OF THE PLAY AREA

In accordance with Government guidance this Play Area is now available for use. However, it is important to remember that the Covid-19 virus can survive on hard surfaces for up to 72 hours.

BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL DOES NOT UNDERTAKE SANITISING OF THIS SITE AND CAN TAKE NO RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY ADVERSE EFFECTS FROM ITS USE. USE OF THE PLAY AREA IS ENTIRELY AT THE RISK OF PARENTS/CARERS WHO SHOULD OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

Do not enter the play area if you or a member of your household has any of the following symptoms (high temperature, new and persistent cough, loss of taste or smell)

Please **maintain social distancing** at all times and ensure that your child also does so, remain 2m apart where at all possible, and **do not enter** if social distancing cannot be maintained.

Please **bring hand sanitiser gel or wipes** to clean hands after using the equipment and consider wiping play equipment before and after your child uses it.

Please try to **only have one parent, guardian or carer with each child or family group** to limit the possible spread of infection. During busy periods it is recommended that people visit for no longer than 20 minutes.

Use of the **swings is restricted to one family group at any one time.**

Children, parents, guardians and carers are advised **not to touch their faces**, and only to cough or sneeze into a tissue or arm when a tissue is not available. Do not put your hands into your mouth or put your mouth on any of the play equipment.

Please **do not consume food or drink in the play area** or on any equipment and dispose of any gloves, masks or litter in the bin by the bus stop or take it home with you.

An Important Message from the Village Hall Trustees

You will see elsewhere in STAB that the village hall AGM, which was due in May this year, has been deferred until 2021 due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The pandemic has highlighted the fact that most of the hall trustees are over 70 and are therefore in the “vulnerable” category. While we are all willing to carry on until the next AGM managing and maintaining the hall, it is clear that this will be a more onerous task than in the past. As a result, a number of the trustees now wish to draw back from organising events such as Moviola film nights, Community Lunches, Coffee Mornings, Spring & Xmas Fayres, Rural Arts etc. These events have become an important part of the social life of Bishopstone, and if the villagers would like them to continue, we need people to come forward and join our organising team of trustees.

If no volunteers come forward many of these activities are likely to cease in the near future.

Questionnaire about Attendance at Future Village Hall Events

Bishopstone Village Hall, which has been closed for some months, will reopen for lettings from 1st September. The hall trustees now need to establish how soon people are likely to be prepared to attend events such as :-

Bishopstone Village Hall rates for private hire

Bishopstone Village Hall has 2 rooms that are available for hire for a wide range of functions. The larger room is ideal for children's parties with lots of space for running around. It can also accommodate wedding receptions, charity functions and large family celebrations.

The smaller room (The Memorial Room) is a good size for meetings and smaller gatherings.

The modern kitchen is spacious and fully equipped with an electric catering range, a professional 4 minute dishwasher, water boiler, hot cupboard, microwave oven, 2 fridges and a freezer, all suitable for professional caterers. There is also glassware, crockery and cutlery for over 80 people.

The hire charges include use of heating and electricity.

The rates are currently:

Parties – per event/day	£100	£150

Broadband

An additional charge is made for use of the broadband connection of £6 per hour with a maximum of £25 per day.

Large projection screen

Use of this professional quality screen is charged at an additional £10 per event.

The hire period must include time to set up and clear away after the event.

Coronavirus Update

The Government is gradually easing restrictions which means that everyone can go out more and undertake a wider range of activities. However, the virus is still out there and the Government's advice to the over 70s continues to be that they should take particular care to minimise contact with others outside their household and be especially diligent about social distancing and hand hygiene.

From 1 August, the government will pause shielding for the clinically extremely vulnerable (unless the transmission of COVID-19 in the community starts to rise significantly). However, you may still be at risk of severe illness if you catch coronavirus, so you are advised to stay at home as much as you can and continue to take precautions when you do go out. Detailed guidance for this group is available on the village website.

The support arrangements that we have put in place in the village will therefore continue as before for all those who need them. This includes the collection of prescriptions from Sixpenny Handley (see below), shopping for essential supplies etc. **Please continue to contact your Area Co-ordinator if you need any of these services.**

Testing

If you suspect that you have coronavirus symptoms you must get a test. It is easy and free. You can get a test online by going to [nhs.uk](https://www.nhs.uk) or by calling 119. Our nearest testing centre is the Beehive Parking site in Salisbury, so it is very close. Further detail is at:

Prescription Collections

Prescription collections will now be undertaken on **Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays**. If you want a prescription collected, please contact your Area Co-ordinator well before the date when your prescription is due and ask for it to be collected on either the Monday, Wednesday or Friday preceding the due date or immediately afterwards if you have sufficient supplies to allow that.

Please use the prescription collection service – it simplifies things for the surgery, reduces queuing and the number of vehicles travelling to Sixpenny Handley. We are collecting for others – so one more makes little difference!



Update on Fibre Broadband in Bishopstone

There has been some speculation in the village recently about the imminent arrival in the village of full fibre broadband, partly due to the fanfare which greeted its arrival in Salisbury recently. I took it upon myself to approach Openreach and get the lowdown.

So what is full fibre broadband, what difference does it make, and when are we getting it?

The first 2 questions are relatively easy to answer. To give you some background, there are currently 3 ways to get broadband. The first is via a copper network (ADSL) where a copper phone line connects to the exchange. This is fairly slow. The second is FTTC, or Fibre to the Cabinet. This increases basic broadband speeds by connecting powerful fibre optic cable to the cabinet, then copper wires to your home or business. This is available in 96 per cent of the UK – that's 28.4 million homes and businesses. At the moment, only 14.6 million people are using it. This is available in Bishopstone, so if you are one households which has yet to sign up, you could be suffering slow broadband speeds unnecessarily. With FTTC you can typically expect a minimum of 24Mbps at a range of approx. 1,200 metres from the cabinet. The nearer the property is to the cabinet, the greater the speed.

The ultimate for fast speeds is Fibre to the Premises (FTTP). Here an optical fibre goes all the way from the exchange into your home or business. It offers speeds of up to 330Mbps. It's sometimes referred to as 'Full Fibre' because the fibre runs from the telephone exchange all the way to the interior of the property. This is what has just been rolled out to 20000 properties in Salisbury, starting in March 2019 and completing 12 months later.

Openreach work on three different programmes; government-funded BDUK programmes like Wiltshire Online; their own Fibre Cities programme (funded by Openreach– Salisbury is an example of this); and for any communities not in scope for either the commercial programme or the government-funded programme, they have a Community Fibre Partnership programme, where they work with communities to create a bespoke fibre solution with a joint funding arrangement.

Unfortunately, Bishopstone lies outside the area covered by the Salisbury Fibre Cities initiative so I presumed nobody in Bishopstone has FTTP. However, when I contacted Wiltshire Online – a Wiltshire Council group – and asked them if they had any plans to roll out FTTP to the village, I received a very full response from Adrian, from the Wiltshire Online Team. He said:

*‘I’ve reviewed the generic Bishopstone area against the list of premises in our current and future build plans and they don’t feature in any further upgrade plans at this time as.....the area is currently largely served by a previously State Aid funded FTTC solution , **with a small amount of FTTP premises also in the area (Whitlock Rise / Meadow View).**’*

If you are one of those lucky few in Whitlock Rise or Meadow View who have FTTP, I would be interested to hear about your experience of this Rolls-Royce of broadband connections.

There is still some hope for the village however, though how much hope depends on the level of trust you place in pledges made by political parties during elections. You may remember during the December 2019 General Election, the now Conservative government made a manifesto commitment to cover the whole of the UK with “gigabit-capable” broadband services by 2025 and to spend £5bn on helping to reach those in the hardest to reach areas. Obviously they may have been distracted from this issue by slightly more pressing matters of late.

The only other option if villagers and local businesses want the speeds offered by FTTP is to go down the route of a Community Fibre Partnership programme. This involves local villagers and businesses expressing an interest to Openreach, gathering support and grant funding, and ultimately paying towards the setting up of the system. Accident on Bishopstone High Road

A single vehicle collision took place on the High Road just west of Harvest Lane on 24 June which blocked the road for a considerable period. The driver was trapped in the vehicle for some time until the emergency services released her. Wiltshire Air Ambulance was called to the scene and parked their helicopter on an adjacent field. The response from residents was commendable and involved local medically trained villagers offering first aid and many people engaged in redirecting traffic. As Mill Lane is a single-track lane it was decided not to redirect traffic around the accident site but to get vehicles to turn around and return the way they had come. An investigation has been carried out by Wiltshire Police's Road Policing Unit to establish the cause of the incident, which left the female driver suffering with a broken arm and requiring hospital treatment. It is believed that the driver of the vehicle involved suffered a medical episode prior to colliding with a telegraph pole.



Meteorites or iron ore?

Holiday Activities from Wiltshire Council

Parents looking for summer activities for their 5 – 12 year olds can now find a wealth of opportunities all in one handy brochure - <http://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/downloads/23245>.

Wiltshire Council has asked local providers to send details of activities including charges, venues and dates to help parents plot how to keep children busy over the summer holidays. The activities are aimed at 5 – 12 year olds and are particularly to help those families with vulnerable children and children of key workers who need support over the summer.

The document is online and people are encouraged to check in regularly as the information will be constantly updated as new providers finalise details of their activities.

Wiltshire Council has also asked all providers to ensure they have the necessary protocols and checks in place including procedures that enable them to adhere to the latest government guidance on social distancing. Parents are reminded to always thoroughly research any childcare provision themselves before booking places for their children.

Cllr Laura Mayes, Cabinet Member for Children, Education and Skills said: “We know there are many families who will be looking for summer holiday activities for their children. This booklet is not an exhaustive list but it does provide a range of opportunities from across Wiltshire which we hope people will find useful.

Carer Support Wiltshire

Carer Support Wiltshire, the charity that supports unpaid carers in Wiltshire, has launched a ‘Time for Carers Appeal’ to raise money that will allow carers to take a break.

Carers often struggle to find time for themselves; for hobbies and to socialise with others. They may not be able to leave the person they look after on their own at home, or they feel guilty taking time to enjoy themselves. Many have been hit hard by the coronavirus pandemic as the closure of day centres and other groups have meant they are caring more than ever, in more difficult circumstances with little or no support.

Research shows that 40% of carers haven’t taken a day off from their caring role in over a year. Yet taking regular breaks has been shown to be the most effective way to reduce feelings of loneliness and isolation and promote good mental health.

Previous appeals have enabled all sorts of breaks, by providing cinema memberships, climbing sessions, spa days and counselling sessions. It has also been used to pay for respite care.

Carer Support Wiltshire are looking for individuals, businesses and local groups to help to raise funds for the appeal or to donate. More information can be found at carersupportwiltshire.co.uk/timeforcarers.

Gary's Climb



In the June edition of STaB one of our readers asked if anyone knew the provenance of the name of the section of steep footpath which climbs from Crouchston Drove to the Ox Drove. A wooden sign at the bottom announces that this is 'Gary's Climb'. A little research by the editorial team has revealed that this is in fact a tribute to local man, Gary Kelly who was tragically killed in an accident on the A354 just outside Coombe Bissett in 2014. A Harnham resident, Gary was a

keen mountain-biker, and would often cycle in this area. He was cycling along the road when a lorry knocked him off his bike, resulting in the injuries from which he would not recover.

Gary was well-loved in his local community and raised a lot of money for charity, including pushing his friend up Snowdon in a wheelchair to raise funds for Cancer Backup.

Naming the hill Gary's Climb seems like a lovely gesture of remembrance for someone who enjoyed our local countryside so much.

Recipes of the Month - To use a Glut of Vegetables

Marrow and Ginger Jam

4 Unwaxed Lemons

1.8kg Marrow, peeled and cut to the size of a sugar cube

1.8kg of Jam sugar (with pectin)

85g of fresh ginger, peeled and shredded.

1. Pare the zest from the lemons with a peeler, then juice them, keeping the juice, shells and any pips.
2. Tie the shells and pips into a muslin bag.
3. Put the marrow into a preserving pan with 2 tbsp of the lemon juice, then cook on a medium heat, stirring often, until the pieces are turning translucent and soft but not mushy.
4. Bubble off any juices before stirring in the sugar, the rest of the juice, the zest, ginger and the muslin bag. Stir until the sugar dissolves.
5. Bring to the boil, then simmer for about 10-15 mins or until the marrow has softened completely and the jam has reached setting point.
6. Pot the jam into warm jars. The flavour of the jam will mature and intensify over the next few months, so tuck it away in a dark, cool place.

Lemony Courgette Linguine (Jamie Oliver) - serves 2

150 g dried linguine

2 courgettes

½ a bunch of fresh mint (15g)

30 g Parmesan cheese

1 lemon

1. Cook the pasta in a pan of boiling salted water according to the packet instructions, then drain, reserving a mugful of cooking water.
2. Meanwhile, slice the courgettes lengthways, then again into long matchsticks with good knife skills or using the julienne cutter on a mandolin or a spiralizer.
3. Place a large non-stick frying pan on a medium-high heat with 1 tablespoon of olive oil, then add the courgettes.
4. Cook for 4 minutes, stirring, whilst finely slicing the mint leaves.
5. Toss the drained pasta and sliced mint into the courgette pan with a splash of reserved cooking water.
6. Finely grate in most of the Parmesan and a little lemon zest, squeeze in all the juice, toss well, then taste and season to perfection with sea salt and black pepper.
7. Dish up, finely grate over the remaining Parmesan and drizzle with 1 teaspoon of extra virgin olive oil before tucking in.

Fresh Tomato Spaghetti

Summer seasonal recipe taking from the book "The Kitchen Revolution" by Rosie Sykes, Polly Russell and Zoe Heron.

Takes 20 mins, serves 4 people.

350g-450g spaghetti (depending how hungry you are)

500g of fresh ripe tomatoes.

75ml of olive oil.

2 handfuls of fresh basil, chopped roughly

50g-75g parmesan

½ lemon

300g cottage cheese

80g-100g Rocket

Salt and pepper

1. Start to cook Spaghetti as per instructions.
2. Prepare the sauce by chopping tomatoes into 1cm chunks and drain them in a colander to remove excess fluid while you chop the rest. Once all of the tomatoes are cut, put into a bowl.
3. Combine the tomatoes with most of the oil (reserve 1 tablespoon of oil), squeeze in the lemon juice and add the basil, 1 teaspoon of salt and pepper to taste, set aside at room temp to infuse.
4. Grate parmesan into a serving bowl.
5. Just before spaghetti is cooked add cottage cheese to tomato sauce, combine well and season for taste.
6. Drain spaghetti and add tomato mixture to it, divide between 4 bowls.
7. Make rocket salad, by tossing rocket in the remaining olive oil, with a squeeze of lemon and salt and pepper seasoning.
8. Serve tomato spaghetti with rocket salad and parmesan to taste.



Sarah's Gardening Tips

1. A fun plant to show kids is the Selaginella Lepidophylla or resurrection plant. It comes as a dried, brown, scrunched-up ball but turns green and unfurls when placed in a dish of water (see picture below).
2. Repot bulbs in pots into fresh compost during August to give them fresh nutrients.
3. To control slugs try Nemaslug or organic ferric phosphate pellets.
4. Apply a thick mulch around plants to combat drought. Garden compost, bark, gravel or even cardboard can be used.
5. Keep feeding plants through the late summer with liquid seaweed or make a comfrey feed.
6. Collect seeds (especially from annuals) for sowing next year. Store in a cool dry place in a paper bag or envelope.
7. Look out for earwigs which will nibble dahlias. Trap them in a straw-filled up-turned pot and rehome them in a fruit tree where they will control other pests.
8. Keep picking runner beans , blanche and freeze them if you have a glut, or make chutney!




