Hello from the Revd Jenny Taylor

Lent begins on Wednesday 1st March, just over a month away. This year feels a little odd with our church being closed so we cannot follow Lent in our usual way. Lent is of course, the six weeks leading up to the glorious festival of Easter, which will be even more joyous this year with a

re-wired, re-heated, re- lit and re-decorated church!

Traditionally Lent has been a time of fasting, of abstinence, of "giving-up" in preparation for the feasting at Easter. It is also a time when we think more deeply about our faith by reading or studying, by developing our prayer life, perhaps revisiting our worship pattern. In recent years it has increasingly become a time of giving to charity – often as a result of giving up chocolate and passing on the proceeds!

In the Valley this year we are following a "two-pronged" Lent. We are, in conjunction with our Diocesan movement of *Renewing Hope – Pray Serve Grow*, concentrating on Prayer – both personal and public - and we are going to be buying bicycles! The bikes are for our link Diocese of Cueibet in South Sudan - £200 apiece – which will enable their clergy to see and help all their people who live in such isolation. Our aim is to buy 25 bikes so perhaps you will be inspired to get your own bikes out to ride for South Sudan!

You are all invited to Afternoon Tea in Bishopstone Village Hall on Sunday 5th March – there will be stalls to browse, cakes to eat and opportunities to buy a wheel or two!

Our Lent leaflet outlines all the talks, meetings, services and charity events that are going to take place and we are hopeful that, together as a whole Valley, we will ensure that our Lent is a generous one to God, to South Sudan and to our communities.

God our Father, renew our hope.
By the Holy Spirit's power strengthen us
to pray readily,
serve joyfully
and grow abundantly,
rejoicing in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting of the Parish Council took place on Thursday 12th January. Details are in the minutes of the meeting which are available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk). The main issues considered were:

- The provision of a Public Access Defibrillator in the village: The meeting was attended by Julia Doel from the South West Ambulance Service. She explained the role of PADs in saving the life of anyone suffering a sudden cardiac arrest. These devices are now widely available and increasingly used to restart the heart of a victim of SCA. When used very soon after collapse (within two or three minutes), many can survive. These units are simple to use and have built in safeguards that mean that the condition of the victim cannot be made worse. The SWAS is promoting the provision of these devices in villages throughout Wiltshire. She also explained the various options for setting up a PAD project, including one in which the defibrillator, heated cabinet etc is leased from SWAS, with them providing maintenance and training for the village. It was decided in principle to provide a PAD and that it should be sited on the external wall of the Village Hall. Final decisions will be taken at the March meeting once comparative quotes are obtained from alternative providers, and for the cost of servicing, maintenance and installation.
- The proposed mobile phone mast: The Parish Council had submitted comments to Wiltshire Council strongly supporting the proposal. So far 14 residents had also submitted written comments, all of which were in support of the proposal. The only objection submitted had come from the Landscape and Planning Advisor to the Cranborne Chase Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. It is expected that Wiltshire Council will make a decision on this application by early February. This will be reported on the village website and STaB in March.
- Road signs: The junction warning sign for Whitlock Rise had now been put in place. The Community
 Area Transport Group had agreed the provision of "single track road" warning signs for Mill Lane,
 though it was unlikely that these will be in place before the occupation of the Faulston Barns development. It was agreed that arrangements should be made to brief new residents about preferred routes
 to the new houses.
- Highway Maintenance: The new Parish Steward was now in place and making regular visits to the village to carry out minor works of road maintenance, gully and grip clearance, cutting back hedges and vegetation etc. The Clerk met the Steward before Christmas to discuss what could be done to improve the drainage situation in Pitts Lane. The Parish Council submits a list of priority works each month, so please inform the Clerk if you notice work that is required.
- Discussions had also taken place with the Community Area Transport Group and Wiltshire Council to
 get the road white lines repainted along the High Road and at road junctions in the village. Notification
 had now been received that the C12 is likely to be closed on 21/22 February 2017 for surface dressing,
 repainting of road markings and associated works. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses, though delays may occur.
- Emergency Planning: The Emergency Planning Co-ordinator (Roger Stockton) the two Flood Wardens (Chris Sexton and Nigel Peasley) and other members of the Emergency Response Group had now trial tested the new village emergency equipment (including generator, three water pumps, gel bags, sand bags and filler). These were now available for use by the group.
- Car parking in Butt Lane: Fresh concern was raised about cars being parked in Butt Lane opposite the White Hart. This makes it very difficult for the various school buses which collect children from the pub car park to maneuver in and out. Residents in Netton Close have off street car parking provision so there is no need for cars to be parked where they form this obstruction. It was agreed to approach the responsible residents again to ask for their co-operation in this matter.

- Recreation Field: Rob Thorne had informed the Council that he has decided that it is time he gave up his role of regularly mowing the Recreation Field. The Chairman, Cllr John Gibbon, said that he wished to put on record the grateful thanks of the Council for the years of voluntary effort Rob had contributed to the village. Alternative arrangements for the maintenance of the Recreation Field would now be put in place.
- A further "litter pick" in the village is proposed for 3-5 March and attention was drawn to the fact that
 Parish Council elections will take place in May. Both of these matters are the subject of separate notices in this STaB.

The next meeting of the Council will be on Thursday 9th March 2017 following the Annual Parish Meeting which begins at 7.00pm in the Village Hall. All are welcome to attend.

BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

On Thursday **4 May 2017** there will be local elections for both Wiltshire Council and Parish Councils. All seven places on Bishopstone Parish Council will be up for election (existing Councillors will be able to stand again).

To be able to stand as a candidate at a parish council election in England you must:

be at least 18 years old;

be a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any member state of the European Union; and

meet at least <u>one</u> of the following four qualifications: be registered as a local government elector for the parish, or, during the 12 months prior to the election, have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish, have had your main or only place of work in the parish or have lived in the parish, or within three miles of it.

The Parish Council is responsible for the well-being of the village and for resolving local issues. It provides amenity improvements and looks after the Recreation Field, Children's Play Area and the allotments in The Styles. It is responsible for overseeing implementation of the Bishopstone Plan and the co-ordination of Emergency Planning arrangements. It plays an important role in representing the parish in meetings with Wiltshire Council and other bodies to ensure necessary works are carried out to highways, drainage etc, and in commenting on planning applications which affect the village. The Council meets six times a year.

Nominations for the election have to be submitted by **4**th **April**. I am giving this early notice so that anyone who is interested in standing has time to consider doing so and, if they wish, to contact me for an informal chat about what is involved. **More detail about submitting nominations will be included in the March edition of STaB.**

The new heating will be very welcome by everyone, as we all know how cold and damp the church can get in winter. Unfortunately, poor Rev Jenny and the celebrants will not really benefit from this when at the High Altar. We just pray they stay warm!

Services will continue to be held either in Broad Chalke Church or in the village hall. The notice below shows where and when services will be held over this time. We should be able to let you know in the next edition of STaB, when we can return full-time to our own church. In the meantime, please continue to support us. Incidentally, do you know what 'PCC' stands for? It is the Parochial Church Council, which manages the services, the maintenance of the structure of the church and supervises the finances. The Council meets about 4 times a year, under the chairmanship of the Rev, and the meetings can be fun and furious! JHST pp PCC.



FLOOD AWARENESS

It is that time of year again!

In the last 10 months there has been extensive clearing of the river over much of its length throughout the village. Thank you to all those who have done their bit!

Unfortunately, as we know from past experience, it is often groundwater flooding from springs rather than the river overflowing that causes real problems in times of excessive rain.

So far this year we have been very lucky and at the time of writing - just after Christmas - water levels are very low. However the law of averages might suggest that we may have heavy rainfall in late winter to even out the figures for precipitation.

So the first reminder is that it is a householder's responsibility to protect their property. Advice has been given and is readily available and the village website gives details of suitable products home owners can procure for their own protection.

In addition the village is now far better prepared than it was in the winter of 2013/14.

Flood Wardens for the village are **Nigel Peasley (780713)** for the Western half of the village and **Chris Sexton (718701)** for the Eastern half of the village, the dividing line being Faulston Bridge.

"At Risk" properties were identified in 2014 and owners were encouraged then to take action.

A team of Area Representatives have been designated - do you know who your representative is? If not, check with your Flood Warden or with Mike Ash (Parish Clerk) or Roger Stockton (Emergency Planning).

The village now has a limited supply of stores and equipment - primarily for dealing with Parish emergencies. One training course has already been run and others will be arranged in the near future by the Flood Wardens for their teams.






