#### IMAGINATIONS





#### **MOBILE PHONE MAST**

The Parish Council has received a pre-planning application consultation by Vodaphone/ Telephonica on a proposal to erect a mobile phone mast to serve the village. The proposed site is shown on the map below. It is on the down north of the village, alongside the track running up from the Recreation Field. Support for a mobile phone mast to serve the village was one of the agreed actions in the Bishopstone Plan (2015). There will be full public consultation on the planning application for the mast when it is received. #### Chalke Valley Challenge 10k and 3k runs Sunday 16th October, 10.30am

Have you been inspired by Rio 2016? If so, now is your chance to challenge yourself!

Now in the 11<sup>th</sup> year the Chalke Valley Challenge (CVC), aims to be more successful than ever. The CVC is a Fundraising 10k Road Race and 3K Fun Run through the beautiful Chalke Valley. The 10K course winds through the villages of Broad Chalke and Bowerchalke and the picturesque countryside in between.

The event raises funds for the children of Broad Chalke Primary School, helping provide additional equipment and opportunities for them throughout the school year.

The 3k fun run is open to everybody from toddlers, to school children and adults of all ages, so the whole family can join in. There are prizes for Under 10 and Under 16 competitors with separate girls and boys trophies, therefore recognising the top competitors in each age group.

The 10K run is an adult's only event and can be entered by anyone over 16. The course is quite challenging but takes in the beautiful countryside around us. There are a total of 14 trophies for different age categories of men & women and overall winners for the 10K race.

As well as local runners, parents and siblings of fun runners often take part to make it a family day out. The event regularly attracts over 300 competitors across the two distances.

The atmosphere is amazing and you will have a great day as well as helping raise money for a great cause.

The event is sponsored each year by Discover Adventure, Myddelton and Major Estate Agents and for their eighth year Westover Group, who also kindly provide race cars on the day to show the 10k competitors the route and to make sure everyone is over the finish line safe and sound. On the day there will be an organised warm up by 'Girls Love Fit' before the race and refreshments on hand pre and post run.

The Chalke Valley Challenge is organised entirely by volunteers and is part of a charity, Friends of Broad Chalke School (FOBS), Charity number 1106909. In past years, the money from the CVC has partly paid for new playground facilities and extra-curricular activities which hugely enhance the children's education. The CVC is expected to raise approximately £2,500.

Entry fees in advance are between  $\pounds 6 - \pounds 12$  inclusive of a mug for the 10K race runners and a medal for the 3K. The charge increases by  $\pounds 4$ , for on the day entries. (Registration on the day starts at 9:30am and ends at 10.10am)

#### **BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL**

Meetings of the Parish Council took place on both Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> August and Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> September. The first meeting was held to consider how to respond to consultations by Wiltshire Council on a number of planning applications in the village. Details of the decisions reached are available in the minutes of that meeting available on the village website (<u>www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk</u>). The meeting on 8<sup>th</sup> September was a normal meeting of the Council, the minutes of which are also available on the website. The main items considered at that meeting were:

- Only two people have responded to the request in September's STaB for views on possible locations for a bench to mark the Queen's reign with one vote for each of the two suggested locations! If anybody wishes to express a view, there is still time. It is proving difficult to secure agreement of the owners of the land by the Beech trees above Faulston Bowl and the logistics of installing a bench there might anyway prove problematic. The site in the old road across The Alley is more straightforward. Estimates of costs will be secured and a final decision taken in November.
- The proposal for a pavement to be built along the south side of the High Road between Meadow View and Whitlock Rise will be discussed at the next meeting of Wiltshire Council's Community Area Transport Group. However, the cost may prove prohibitive. It was agreed to make enquiries as to whether any less formal treatment, eg a gravel surface, would be allowed.
- A meeting had been held with the new Police Inspector in charge in Salisbury about policing in the Chalke Valley. He had stressed the importance of reporting all incidents of crime, or attempted crime, via the 999 or 101 telephone lines. Police resources are deployed on the basis of the available statistics. The e-mail alert system that had been operated by PC Pete Jung has now ended and the "Community Messaging" service should be used instead if you want to receive up to date reports on criminal activity in our area (see separate note in this STaB).
- The Community Speed Watch now has six trained volunteers. 20,000 car movements have been monitored to date in the village and 465 vehicles reported for speeding.
- It was suggested that consideration should be given again to setting up a Vodaphone Rural Sure Signal system in the village. This was previously considered in 2014 and not pursued. It would require about five or six households in the village to have an antenna mounted on their house and connected to their broadband. There would be an annual charge and it would only provide a mobile signal to Vodaphone users. It was agreed to mention this in STaB to see if there were sufficient volunteers (please contact Mike Ash if you are interested).
- River clearance work upstream of Faulston Bridge has been completed and an update of the village Emergency Plan will be issued once the new generator and pumps have been received.
- The case in favour of the proposed extension of 8 Whitlock Rise was presented to the Council by the applicant. It was pointed out that the Parish Council's comments on the application needed to reflect the balance of opinion in the village.

Finally, it was reported that further damage had been done to the Play Train in the Recreation Field. Work had only just been completed to repair the damage reported in September's STaB. It was suggested that if this pattern continues the Council may have no alternative but to dismantle the train and remove it as it could not continue spending money on repairs, neither could it be left in an unsafe condition. **PLEASE IF YOU KNOW WHO IS RESPONSIBLE, OR SEE VANDALISM OCCURRING, PLEASE LET THE PARISH COUNCIL KNOW**.

The next meeting of the Council will be on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2016 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. All are welcome to attend.

### **REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 2016**





It is 100 years since the Battle of the Somme which involved both British and French troops. Nearly 20,000 British soldiers were killed on 1<sup>st</sup> July 1916, including Pte Edgar Dimmer of the 5<sup>th</sup> Bn Wiltshire Regiment. His parents Fred and Jane Dimmer lived at Upper Faulstone. He has no known grave, and is remembered on the Thiepval Memorial.

With him, we remember Pte Hubert Bryant 1<sup>st</sup> Bn Hampshire Regiment and LCpl Edward Collins 1<sup>st</sup> Bn Royal West Kent Regiment, who also were killed in action on The Somme, and are remembered on the Thiepval Memorial.

Our Remembrance Service will be in our Church at 1050 a.m. on Sunday 13th November.

Now listen in....! Service: starts at 1050 hrs. Silence for Remembrance: at 1100 hrs. Dress: No2 dress with belt, No 1 dress cap, medals for serving personnel. Others in civilian suits, (medals as appropriate for exservice personnel) and regimental ties. Fall-out: approx. 1200 hrs.

After the service, Greg and his Team at The White Hart will have the usual curry lunch from 1200hrs onwards. Please ring Greg or Zara at the White Hart (780244), or me (780683), to reserve places. The cost is again £12 per head, with a collection for the Royal British Legion after the meal. (Please remember to pay Greg for the curry and any drinks before you leave!)

We look forward to a good gathering of veterans and friends. All are welcome to both service and lunch, of whatever age, and veterans are invited to wear their medals.

#### REMEMBERING.....



Most people in the village will have been aware of the explosion of red poppies in the fields at Faulston and paradoxically, at the same time, the commemoration ceremonies taking place in the UK and France for the 100th anniversary of start of the Battle of The Somme.

I had the privilege of attending a commemoration ceremony at the invitation of the village of Foncquevillers at the northern end of the Somme battlefield. It was here on 1st July 1916, four battalions of my own regiment, The Sherwood Foresters, The Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment went into action in a diversionary attack on the Gommecourt Salient.

For many reasons, in common with other parts of the 18 mile long battlefield, the attack failed. Lack of surprise, deep German defensive positions inexorably linked together, uncut wire, ineffective bombardments and poor high command decision-making led to the destruction of the two leading battalions, the 5th recruited from the mining villages of Derbyshire and the 7th from the City of Nottingham.

At the end of the bloodiest day in British military history the 5th Bn had suffered 80% casualties and the 7th Bn 74% casualties, with one company of 120 men receiving 94% casualties, all in the first dreadful few hours of the battle. These units had all been based around the small village of Foncquevillers, a slightly smaller village than Bishostone.

So on 1 July 2016 former officthe Commonwealth War Commission Cemetery at Le Maire, French veterans, village and most of the popufallen of 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th with a special wreath laid by Nottinghamshire on behalf of



ers and soldiers gathered in Grave Foncquevillers with Madam children of the lation to lay wreaths for the Battalions HM Lord Lieutenant of the two counties.

In addition a further wreath was placed on the grave of Captain John Green VC, the medical officer of 7th Bn, killed while rescuing soldiers hung on the wire entanglements in front of German positions.

After the war in 1920, the City of Derby adopted and helped to fund the rebuilding of the village to its former glory thereby establishing a bond that remains to this day.

Later this year, on the eve of the 100th anniversary of the end of the Battle off The Somme, 17th November, there will be a talk in the village hall about the  $\mu$  hole battle with proceeds going to two charities, Combat Stress and the Defence National Rehabilitation Centre.

## **POPPIES REMEMBERING THE SOMME 100**

July was a month for military remembrance, as both Roger Stockton and I visited northern France, to remember our Regimental forebears at the Battle of the Somme. This great battle began on 1<sup>st</sup> July 1916 and went on sporadically until the end in November. On that first day, 20,000 men were killed in the British ranks ... and countless more over the succeeding months.

I started my Army career in the Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers, an Irish infantry regiment, and then the Royal Irish Rangers, and we joined our Regimental centenary tour of the Somme battlefields to remember the men of the 10<sup>th</sup> (IRISH), the 16<sup>th</sup> (IRISH) and the 36<sup>th</sup> (ULSTER) Divisions who took part in this epic battle. However, I could not forget the men from Bishopstone who laid down their lives there. Three are named on the Thiepval Memorial, Pte Dimmer, LCpl Collins and Pte Bryant. They have no known grave and are only remembered on this great memorial and in our church.

Three other men on our village memorial are named on the famous Menin Gate Memorial in Ypres, where we had more time to explore the detail. Pte Rowden and Pte Williams were both in 1 Wilts and Pte Thick was in 2 Wilts. They are listed with all the others of the Wiltshire Regiment, and remembered every evening at 8 pm when the local Fire Brigade sound the Last Post for all those on this great memorial. It was a salutary tour as wherever we went the poppies were in the fields over which these brave lads had fought and died, to remind us of their sacrifice.

We held a short Regimental service at the Thiepval Memorial and laid a Royal Irish wreath. I provided RBL poppies for all those present. Later we laid three crosses at the Wiltshire Regiment tablet on the Menin Gate. It was a truly moving and proud moment to remember those three chaps from the valley. I am returning in October to revisit Thiepval, and will find the names of Bryant, Collins and Dimmer, and lay a cross for them too.
