Parish Council

A meeting of Bishopstone Parish Council took place on Thursday 9th September in the Village Hall. Full minutes of the meeting, together with the papers considered, are available on the village website <u>www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk</u>. Councillors Gibbon, Tatner, Williams and Barter attended together with one member of the public.

The main issues discussed were:

Speeding in the village. Cllr Gibbon welcomed the arrival of the new Speed Indicator Device (SID junior!) which was now operational. He said that whilst there was some hope that drivers would better understand their responsibilities as a result of having the sign there were still too many people driving at high speed through the village. Consideration was also given to the results of traffic surveys undertaken by Wiltshire Council on the village roads. This is reported separately in this STaB.

Tree Planting. The part that the Parish Council might play in planting more trees in the village was discussed. Cllr Williams volunteered to take forward proposals for planting trees in the margins of the Recreation Field. This is also the subject of a separate article in this STaB.

Children's Play Area. It had been agreed at the July meeting that, following the successful additional provision of play equipment for older children in the play area, there should now be some additional provision for the very youngest. It was agreed that any additional equipment needed to be appropriate to the pre-school/early years age group, different in nature from that already available in the play area. Following discussion it was agreed to pursue



proposals for the provision of two "springers" (see illustration), together with an additional bench for parents/carers. A detailed estimate of cost would be obtained and a bid submitted for support from the South West Area Board of Wiltshire Council. A final decision on whether to go ahead would then be taken at a future meeting.

Hydrants. A total of 19 fire hydrants had now been identified in the village (there may be a few more) and a map of their location is being added to the village Emergency Plan.

Broadband. It was noted that the full list of premises to be included in the Fibre To The Premises (FTTP) project had been submitted to Openreach on 23rd August.

Defibrillator. A proposal was put forward for the village to have a second community defibrillator, to be housed in the soon to be defunct phone box opposite

Pitts Lane. This would be more accessible from the east end of the village compared to the current defibrillator at the Village Hall. This idea will be investigated for discussion at the next meeting.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Thursday 11th November at 7.00pm in the Village Hall.

In June's edition of STaB there was an article about encouraging more tree planting in the village and on the project *"The Queen's Green Canopy"* to promote the planting of trees to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. Trees need to be planted as part of the strategy for combatting climate change and to replace the many trees now being lost, eg through Ash Die-back.

It is for every landowner in the village to consider what more they can do – from planting individual trees to small woodlands. At its meeting on 9th September the Parish Council considered what more it can do as regards the land it owns in the village. It was decided to go ahead with a project to plant young trees in the spaces available at the north east and north west corners of the Recreation Field. An application has now been submitted to the Woodland Trust for one of their free packs of 30 saplings. If successful this pack will be delivered in March 2022.

Councillor Simon Williams agreed to take on responsibility for overseeing this project and he is looking for other volunteers to join him. When the time comes we need to involve the whole community, particularly young people, in planting the trees and ensuring that they thrive. The project team will also endeavour to help other landowners with their tree planting schemes.





The Trussell Trust

This month I have no donations to report and so I am copying something from their Facebook page for your information.

"In Salisbury today there are families and individuals struggling to put food on the table. For many a sudden crisis, redundancy, benefit delay or even an unexpected bill – can mean going hungry. Salisbury foodbank provides emergency food and support for local people in crisis.

All food is donated by the public and is non-perishable and in-date. Food is then sorted by volunteers.

Frontline care professionals such as doctors and social workers identify people in crisis and can issue food vouchers. Clients receive three days of nutritionally balanced, non-perishable food in exchange for their food voucher.

At the foodbank centre, volunteers meet clients face to face and offer a listening ear over a cup of tea and a free hot meal as well as giving emergency food. Foodbank centre volunteers signpost people to other professional services to help tackle the root cause of the crisis. Local agencies also provide additional services such as CV clinics, healthy eating courses and housing support advice."

If you can, please continue to support this very worthy cause. You can donate food at most of the supermarkets now but I am still happy to take along anything that is brought to me here at home, or left in our lovely church.

Christmas will be the next cause for many people to feel anxious, especially those with families. It should be a time of happiness for us all so please, think of those who are less fortunate and help to make theirs a Happy Christmas too.

Speeding in the Village

Concerns have regularly been expressed about the speed of vehicles using local roads in the village (Harvest Lane, Butt Lane, etc) with requests for speed limits to be introduced. The Parish Council therefore asked Wiltshire Council to conduct traffic surveys to determine the actual



volume and speed of vehicles using these roads. The timing of the surveys was delayed until after the pandemic lock-down periods and they finally took place over the week beginning 12 July 2021. The counts were undertaken in five locations. The results are set out in the following table.

Location	Total vehicle movements (both directions combined).	Average speed of vehicles (both directions combined - mph)	85 th percentile (both directions combined - mph)
Flamstone St	530	15.7	21.1
Butt Lane	2390	18.2	23.0
Harvest Lane	1786	20.7	26.0
Church Lane	962	18.6	23.9
Faulston Lane	897	16.0	20.8

These results were discussed at the meeting of the Parish Council on 9th September.

It was pointed out that as 85% of all vehicles were travelling at under 30mph there is no case, under the criteria set by the Department for Transport, for 30mph speed limits to be introduced.

Almost all of the research into 20 mph limits indicates that they generally lead to relatively small reductions in average speed (1-2mph); as such they are most appropriate for roads where the average traffic speeds are already low. Wiltshire Council's policy is therefore that they should only be considered for use on roads where mean speeds are already 24mph or less. Against that criteria all the surveyed roads qualify. However, average speeds are already below 20mph and even the 85th percentile level was only marginally above, with Harvest Lane slightly higher. The benefits of introducing speed limits are therefore uncertain and enforcement by the police is unlikely given their resource constraints.

If 20mph limits were to be introduced it would necessitate the erection of signs at the start and end of the zone and of smaller repeater signs at 200m intervals along the roads. The impact of this signage on the appearance of the village has been registered previously as a matter of concern to residents. The Parish Council would also be expected to meet 25% of the cost of the signs and of the legal Traffic Order that would need to be made. Any such proposal would have to be submitted to Wiltshire Council's Community Area Transport Group (CATG) and would only be implemented once it became one of their top five priority schemes

in the South West Wiltshire area.

It was agreed to consult Wiltshire Council's Traffic Engineer on the possible extent of any restriction area and the costs of implementation, with a view to taking a final decision on whether to pursue the introduction of 20mph limits at the meeting of the Parish Council in November.

Time to Clear the River

Property owners with watercourses on their land are reminded that now is the time to make sure that the bed and banks of those watercourses are kept clear of obstructions which may increase flood risk. Watercourses are the River Ebble and its many branches, but also "every stream, ditch, drain, cut, dyke, sluice and passage through

which water flows" (Environment Agency definition). If you own land with a watercourse running through it or if your land borders a watercourse - in which case it is assumed you own the land up to the centre line of the watercourse - you are responsible for maintaining the bed and banks and the trees and shrubs growing on the banks. Anything that impedes water flow should be removed but it is important to ensure that cut material does not flow downstream and cause obstruction.


Please help us reduce flood risk in the village this winter by ensuring that all channels are clear of obstruction.

Wiltshire Council is consulting on two draft inter-related strategies. One concerns climate change and the other covers the natural environment. 





Nature Notes - Sunflowers as Cover Crops

I walked up Croucheston Drove in early September and was delighted to see strips of sunflowers lining the edges of the fields. They are so visually striking and seem to contain a lovely variety of wildflowers. They were also alive with bees. All told, they seem a great improvement on the strips of maize which normally surround the fields.

I was curious to know the reasoning behind this type of planting so contacted the landowner, Nadine Cobham. She indicated that Cobham Farms are part of a conservation scheme subsidised by the Government. When the corn was sown in the Spring, a sunflower and flower mix was drilled in strips in the margins. While it provides pheasant cover for the shoot, it is probably less effective than maize because it is much less dense and flowers die back in the autumn. However, the upside, and the main reason for its use, is that it attracts many more insects and butterflies and so has much greater utility for conservation and diversity. Cobham Farms also have similar wild flower strips at Homington which are equally lovely.

Cobham Farms have plans to revert some of their arable land to downland during the next three years which is good news for residents of Bishopstone and the Chalke Valley. *Rob Pendlenton*







Recipe of the Month - Pumpkin Spice Scones

I seem to have a garden full of pumpkins this year! Fabulous for Hallowe'en of course, but some have ripened too early to carve so I've been on a mission to find ways to use them. Soup is an obvious answer, and I've made a couple of batches already, but I wanted to try something sweet too. This recipe, adapted from BBC Good Food, has proved very popular with everyone in my family.

Ingredients

450g self-raising flour, plus extra for rolling

100g cold butter

50g golden caster sugar

2-3 tsp pumpkin spice (or mix 1 tsp cinnamon, 1 tsp ginger, a good grind of nutmeg and a pinch of allspice)

200g cooked pumpkin

80-100ml milk

Method

Heat oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7.

Put the flour in a bowl and coarsely grate in the butter (dipping the butter into the flour can make it easier to grate; do this as often as you need). Use a butter knife to stir the butter into the flour, then mix in the sugar and spice. You can also do this using a food processor which is much easier and faster!

Add the pumpkin and 80ml milk to the flour mixture and quickly stir everything together. Add a splash more milk if you need to until the dough comes together without being too sticky to handle.

Tip the mixture onto a floured surface and lightly bring together with your hands a couple of times. Roll out until 2cm thick and stamp out rounds with a 7cm cutter. Re-shape the trimmings until all the dough has been used.

Place the scones onto a lightly floured baking sheet and brush the tops with any remaining milk. Bake for 10-12 mins until risen and lightly browned.

Serve warm with butter or cream cheese.



Sarah's Gardening Tips for October

- 1. Lift Dahlia and Begonia tubers to store and dry over the winter months.
- 2. Plant hedges, move trees and shrubs as required.
- 3. If you plan to grow beans next year, start to prepare the site by digging a trench and filling with manure or kitchen waste.
- 4. Harvest pumpkins and squashes before the first frost as they will quickly go mushy.
- 5. Cut back yellowing asparagus foliage to within 5cm of the ground.
- 6. Move citrus trees indoors to a bright frost free position away from cold draughts.
- 7. Wrap grease bands around the trunks of apple trees to trap winter moth females whose caterpillars shred spring flowers.
- 8. Reuse spent compost from annual containers as mulch on the garden.
- 9. Lift and divide any herbaceous perennials while the soil is still warm.






