

A schedule of all the Action Points in the Bishopstone Plan is now available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk). This includes up to date notes on progress against the various proposed actions. Some progress has been made. For example: a Community Speed Watch has been established; broad band speeds in the village have



improved; more play equipment has been provided for toddlers in the Play Area; a new Parish Steward scheme has been negotiated; reminders have been issued to riparian landowners to keep the river clear; and the emergency response plan has been updated, with new equipment to help deal with flooding and other emergencies.

However, it has proved difficult to get volunteers to join an "Implementation Group" to work out how to take forward some of the key points on community support within the village – such as setting up an "Area Helpers" scheme, establishing a youth forum, to find out what more elderly residents require and establishing a register of volunteers. The immediate requirement is not to take on responsibility long term, but to work out the practical steps that might be taken to make these ideas a reality. These proposals were all put forward by local residents during the preparation of the plan and it is clear that without further voluntary effort they will simply not be implemented. ### A BENCH FOR THE QUEEN



### REMEMBERING.....



Most people in the village will have been aware of the explosion of red poppies in the fields at Faulston and paradoxically, at the same time, the commemoration ceremonies taking place in the UK and France for the 100th anniversary of start of the Battle of The Somme.

I had the privilege of attending a commemoration ceremony at the invitation of the village of Foncquevillers at the northern end of the Somme battlefield. It was here on 1st July 1916, four battalions of my own regiment, The Sherwood Foresters, The Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment went into action in a diversionary attack on the Gommecourt Salient.

For many reasons, in common with other parts of the 18 mile long battlefield, the attack failed. Lack of surprise, deep German defensive positions inexorably linked together, uncut wire, ineffective bombardments and poor high command decision-making led to the destruction of the two leading battalions, the 5th recruited from the mining villages of Derbyshire and the 7th from the City of Nottingham.

At the end of the bloodiest day in British military history the 5th Bn had suffered 80% casualties and the 7th Bn 74% casualties, with one company of 120 men receiving 94% casualties, all in the first dreadful few hours of the battle. These units had all been based around the small village of Foncquevillers, a slightly smaller village than Bishostone.

So on 1 July 2016 former officers and soldiers gathered in the Commonwealth War Grave Commission Cemetery at Foncquevillers with Madam Le Maire, French veterans, children of the village and most of the population to lay wreaths for the fallen of 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th Battalions with a special wreath laid by HM Lord Lieutenant of Nottinghamshire on behalf of the two counties.



In addition a further wreath was placed on the grave of Captain John Green VC, the medical officer of 7th Bn, killed while rescuing soldiers hung on the wire entanglements in front of German positions.

After the war in 1920, the City of Derby adopted and helped to fund the rebuilding of the village to its former glory thereby establishing a bond that remains to this day.

Later this year, on the eve of the 100th anniversary of the end of the Battle off The Somme, 17th November, there will be a talk in the village hall about the whole battle with proceeds going to two charities, Combat Stress and the Defence National Rehabilitation Centre.

### **BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL**

A meeting of the Parish Council took place on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> July. The minutes of the meeting are available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk). The main items considered were:

- A grant of £4100 has been received from Scottish and Southern Energy. This will be used to purchase a stand-by generator, two water pumps and two-way radios for the emergency response team.
- Possible locations for a bench to mark the Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> birthday and long reign (see separate article in this STaB).
- How to re-activate a Neighbourhood Watch in the village (a Bishopstone Plan Action). The present
  co-ordinator in the main part of the village was unable to carry on. Cllr Steve Tatner undertook to
  investigate what needs to be done.
- Proposals had been submitted to Wiltshire Council for a pavement to be provided on the south side
  of the High Road, between Meadow View and Whitlock Rise. This will be considered by the
  Community Area Transport Group.
- As regards the re-organisation of local policing it was resolved to send a letter to PC Pete Jung, on behalf of the parish, thanking him for all that he had done in the village over many years.
- A progress report on actions related to the Bishopstone Plan was circulated (see separate note in this STaB).
- The new Parish Steward arrangements begin on 8<sup>th</sup> October. This should ensure a better service as regards minor road repairs, clearance of grips and ditches etc.
- The Clerk had held an informal meeting with Wiltshire Council planners. They had confirmed that the limits of development in the village, as set out in the Bishopstone Plan, were consistent with the Core Strategy policy on development in small villages.
- A progress report was made on the Faulston Barns development. The developer had indicated that, despite the need to insert a steel frame for structural reasons, over 70% of the original materials were being re-cycled. The development is on schedule for completion in March 2017, when an "open day" for the village will be held.

The next meeting of the Council will be on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> September 2016 at 7.00pm in the Village Hall. All are welcome to attend. Please note earlier start time

### CHIDREN'S PLAY AREA

It is sad to have to report on further damage to the Play Train so soon after its refurbishment. Two of the roofing slats of the engine have been damaged and will need to be replaced. Whether this was by accident, or is another case of deliberate vandalism, it is difficult to say. The net of the basketball ring has also been shredded and will need to be replaced.

Accidental damage is always possible but I would hope that this would be reported to the Parish Council so that any necessary action can be taken to make the equipment safe.

All repairs cost money – in this case the money you have paid in Council Tax – please help us look after the village's recreational amenities.

The Berwick St John Country Fayre, which next takes place on 17th and 18th September 2016, is a much anticipated and hugely popular event that regularly attracts crowds of over 20,000 people.

The Fayre is run by a few Directors and a dedicated team of Committee members, with the entire local community and village residents getting involved. The Directors and Committee have unanimously agreed to continue to support The Salisbury District Hospital, Stars Appeal.

The first Fayre was in 1992 which was in aid of the Wiltshire Air Ambulance, since then other charities which have been supported include Bliss, Naomi House, Great Ormond Street Hospital, Multiple Sclerosis, Asthma UK, Diabetes UK, CLIC, Salisbury Hospital Stars Appeal, and the Dorset Kidney Fund. Since 1992 an incredible amount of money for a small community has been raised and over £175,000 has been given to these charities. The 2012 Fayre raised £27,000 for the Stars Appeal and had over 21,000 visitors over the two days. Thinking that the incredible results of 2012 could not be repeated in 2014 £33,000 was raised and donated to the Stars Appeal.

We work well with the team of volunteers from the Stars Appeal, and knowing exactly where all the money raised goes and is so important to all of us. The work and the difference that the Stars Appeal makes within the fabric of our local hospital is hugely significant and benefits so many. We have established an excellent working relationship with the hospital team and we are all looking forward to working together again September.

Exhibitors arrive on the Friday with live music and the bar opening in the evening. Saturday and Sunday the show takes hold, steam engines, working vintage tractors, classic cars, commercials and bikes, horse ploughing, steam ploughing and many rural crafts. A military vehicle display, fairground rides, craft tent, flower/plant and traditional tea tent as well as trade stands. There is a full line up entertainment in the Beer Tent throughout the weekend.

The Fayre is a working show with tractors and steam engines from all over the country and Europe. Camping is available. Entry is free; all visitors are encouraged to support The Stars Appeal by purchasing raffle tickets on their way in.






