

Dear Editor,

It was lovely to see that people responded to the Editor's request for more articles and items of interest to be included in STaB. It was good to hear more about the village playgroup, and I really enjoyed the article in which Kath Wareham was interviewed, and the intriguing information about the writing on the beech trees. I also liked the way that the village hall information was presented, as it was much clearer.

I understand that the Editor has also received offers of help to produce the magazine each month, which is wonderful.

STaB is a free village magazine which is paid for by the PCC and the Parish Council. Without the generous support of the Parish Council, STaB could not be produced. We also rely on income from advertising and donations from villagers. Sadly, income from advertising and from donations has fallen, and the Church has to pick up that loss, something which it cannot afford to do. Suggestions have been made that we might cut the number of magazines which are printed, or just do it on-line, but having talked to many people, most want a hard copy that is easily to hand, so that they can access the information it contains.

This is a wonderful village where so many people give their time and their talents to serve their neighbours. As a PCC we would like STaB to reflect that vibrant and active community in such a way that more people want to place advertisements, and more people may be motivated to give a voluntary donation to keep it going. In other villages, people are all asked if they would like to donate £5 a year towards the cost of producing their magazine. If this idea won support, any excess funds could then be used by the Church or the Parish council to support the village in other ways.

We are also looking at alternative ways to reduce costs, and some people have come forward with ideas to reformat and restyle the magazine so that there are fewer spaces and paper is used more efficiently. We are also looking to see if there is a cheaper way of getting it printed.

We are all very grateful to our Editor who took over the reins about seven years ago, and has worked so hard. But Judy Barrett is right; if STaB is truly to reflect our village, then more support and ideas are needed from readers to make it a success.

Thank you so much to those of you who have already responded to the Editor's request for help. I hope that we will be able to take all your ideas forward, and have a magazine which is financially secure, and truly reflects our wonderful village.

FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

Dear Bishopstone Resident

I was most concerned that, at the last meeting of the Parish Council, certain residents of Whitlock Rise made a highly personal verbal attack on one of the Council, Councillor Ali Thorne, for failing to adequately clear snow from their road during the bad weather in February. This displayed a great deal of ignorance, both of the logistics of clearing and gritting of snow bound roads and of the role of the Parish Council (which is limited to gritting road junctions after the snow has been cleared). It was also highly disrespectful of someone who contributes so much to our community on a purely voluntary basis. I am therefore calling on those concerned, who I will not name, to apologies to Councillor Thorne for their remarks.

This incident allows me to make a more general point. The Parish Council has very few statutory responsibilities. We do not <u>have</u> to grit roads or do most of the other things we do. This is all done on a voluntary basis by Parish Councilors, by the Clerk and by a very small group of other residents who contribute to the fabric of village life, including improving safety. Thanks to budget constraints Wiltshire Council looks increasingly to Parish and Town Councils to deliver local services using voluntary effort. Put simply, we have to do more for ourselves. The burden associated with all this has grown substantially and we need more people prepared to help, for example:

- If we want to keep our village free of litter we need to organize a litter pick, and a notice was included in March's STaB asking for volunteers. By mid March seven people had volunteered. Without more volunteers, including someone prepared to organise things, it will not happen.
- Plenty of people complain about speeding on our roads, yet we cannot get enough volunteers to help operate the Community Speed Watch and to set up the Speed Indicator Device. Without more volunteers we may not be able to sustain these activities.
- We rely on the Parish Steward to fill small potholes in the roads, to clear drains and gullies to prevent flooding, to cut back vegetation on roadsides etc. But the Parish Council has to draw up his programme of work we need your help in doing this. A separate notice about this is included elsewhere in this edition of STaB.

We have an ageing population in Bishopstone. Many of those who previously helped now find they need, rather than can provide, help. More, younger people need to join in. Please contact me or Mike Ash (bishopstoneclerk@btinternet.com) if you are prepared to register an interest in doing so.

BISHOPSTONE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The Bishopstone Annual Parish Meeting for 2018 took place in the Village Hall on Thursday 8th March at 7.00pm. Fourteen residents from the village attended. The meeting heard reports of activities during the past year provided by the Chairman of the Parish Council John Gibbon, Mr Reg Barratt on behalf of the Trustees of the Rev Augustus Montgomery Coal Charity, Cllr George Brutton, as Church Warden, on behalf of the PCC, Cllr Norman Barter on behalf of the Village Hall Management Committee, Cllr Ali Thorne on behalf of the BishBash Committee and from Kate Pendlenton on behalf of the Mothers and Toddlers Group. Notes on the reports submitted will be available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk).

No matters of general concern in the village were raised for discussion.

BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

The March meeting of the Parish Council followed on from the Annual Parish Meeting. The minutes of the meeting are available on the village website (see above). The main issue discussed was speeding in the village:

- Cllr Piers Edwards and Mr Roger Stockton reported on the further consideration they had given to the problem of persuading Wiltshire Council of the need to extend the 30mph speed limit on Broad Chalke Road to the west of the White Hart and the steps that might be taken to persuade drivers to slow down in the village "back roads". Wiltshire Council has rejected the case for extending the 30mph zone a number of times over the years, including, most recently, when that case was backed by John Glen MP. It is clear that additional evidence will be required if the case is going to be put forward again. This means collecting information on the speed of vehicles and information on any accidents, near misses etc involving vehicles and pedestrians and any other users of the road (such as horses and riders). A notice about this is included elsewhere in this STaB.
- The Parish Clerk, Mike Ash, said that, following the rejection of the most recent request for an extended 30mph limit, Wiltshire Council Director of Highways had suggested that drivers should at least be encouraged to observe the 40mph limit by deploying the village Speed Indicator Device and using the Community Speed Watch Team in that location. Agreement had now been reached with Highway Engineers as to the location of the SID and arrangements to start using that near the White Hart were being made. Use of the Speed Watch in this location required agreement from the police and the first stage involved using a Metro Counter to count the number and speed of vehicles in this section of the road. That count had been arranged to take place during March. The data obtained by the Metro Count might also be useful in providing further evidence for an extension of the 30mph limit.
- As regards the other roads in the village, Roger Stockton said that as previous requests to introduce speed limits on these roads had failed, other options, such a leafleting campaign targeting drivers and more informal signs should be considered. Mike Ash said that any attempt to introduce 20mph limits was unlikely to succeed. However, he had now had a discussion with one of Wiltshire's Highway Engineers and they had suggested that Metro Counts might also be undertaken on these roads to establish the actual speed of vehicles using them. This might provide a justification for at least a 30mph limit. This step had previously been ruled out on cost grounds but it would appear that this was no longer likely to be an issue. It was agreed that arrangements would be made to identify four locations for Metro Counts and a request for counts to be undertaken would be submitted to Wiltshire Council.

Wiltshire Councillor Jose Green reported on the last year and current priority issues for Wiltshire Council. A full copy of her report is attached to the minutes of the meeting on the village website.

Thanks were extended to Cllr Ali Thorne for all his hard work in gritting road junctions in the village following the recent heavy snowfall.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Thursday 10th May at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

DRAG RACING CIRCUIT COMES TO BISHOPSTONE



Following the demise of the racing circuit of 1995 described in an historical article in February's STaB and the request for more serious news reporting, local ace reporter, Ephraim Sandcastle, has discovered that trials are in progress to extend, improve and introduce competitions to the drag racing strip in Harvest Lane.

Residents will well know the area is free of all speed restrictions and is straight, making it ideal for this pastime. The racetrack starts by the de-restriction sign at the junction with the High Road with suitable parking for spectators in adjacent fields.

At the end of the initial straight is a convenient chicane by the sewage plant, known as Pooh Corner. Here competitors will be tested by the camber of the road and the verges before they enter the second drag strip known as Faulston Lane. Further skills are required to avoid the large lumps of Chilmark stone that edge the road, carefully positioned to ensure larger vehicles flatten and leave tyre marks on the raised banks and, following the success of the speed jumps on the previously reported circuit, two bridge jumps are also included.

This second part of the drag strip has a convenient pull-off to the right through controlled gates onto a brand new pit straight leading to the mechanical repair facility and sawdust factory. Finally, after passing the grandstand area at Faulston House, where the famous Chicken Run takes place twice daily to further add to the excitement of the event, there is a sharp left hand turn before the final high speed straight down to the finish by Faulston Barns.

Ephraim managed to speak to the organiser, Silas B Montacute, and asked about future intentions. Mr Montacute was full of enthusiasm and said, "Well, we are intending to introduce Mobile Pensioner Hazards (MPH) to further test the drivers. We have noticed that there often groups of elderly residents, with or without dogs, wandering up and down on the strip so we are keen to gather them into groups to really add to the fun."

Questioned further about participating groups and future events Mr Montacute waxed lyrical about the new Dutch team, Van Rental Racing (VR Racing) run by Jan Rollo-Koster. "Yes we have this very large team of enthusiastic racers. They already have extensive knowledge of the strip and frequently train in the mornings and evenings to coincide with the school run. They are well known for their cheery nature and willingness to engage in social repartee with such banter as "There ain't no speed restriction 'ere, Mrs" and "It ain't a footpath, matey"

Mr Montacute's Personal Assistant, Anida Bath further added, "Also in the summer months we hope to re-engage T&T Racing. They have a special tractor and trailer team and usually only cover the first part of the circuit. You would be absolutely amazed at the speeds they can achieve within this team even when handicapped with loads of grain. Last year they successfully defended their title against the Devon United Straw Trucks (DUST) team from Devon."

Ephraim is due to report next month (hopefully) on the escalating border dispute with Wilton and the escalation of matters to NATO and the UN.

REPORTING ROAD ACCIDENTS IN THE VILLAGE

As reported elsewhere in this STaB, it is clear that if any further attempt is to be made to persuade Wiltshire Council to impose tighter road speed limits in the village it will be necessary to present evidence of the dangers inherent in the current limits. That means compiling a database of any accidents (however minor), near misses etc involving road vehicles or any other examples of bad, or inconsiderate, driving in the village. Whilst the main focus of attention is the main road through the village, keeping records of any accidents on the more minor local roads may help the case for action on speeding there.

If you witness any incident would you please report it to Cllr Piers Edwards (780079 or email piersgedwards@gmail.com).

We will need to compile data over an extended period so the Parish Council would be grateful if you would retain this notice (which we will repeat at intervals in future editions of STaB).

HELP REQUIRED WITH PARISH STEWARD SCHEME



Wiltshire Council's Parish Steward visits our village for a day, once a month. His role is to:

Hand clear blocked drainage grips, gullies and culverts Clear storm debris from roads and footways Trim encroaching hedges and vegetation from roads Clean and secure road signs Hand cut small visibility splays Treat/remove weeds from footways Paint roadside barriers Repair small potholes in roads and footways

The work he actually undertakes on each visit is determined by a worksheet of priority tasks submitted by the Parish Council. I need some assistance in assembling that worksheet.

It would be helpful to have a team of "reporters" who can let me know what needs doing in different parts of the village. All that would be needed is for you to make a note of potholes, blocked gullies etc in your area and to let me know about these once a month.

As a starting point it would be useful to have volunteers for each of the main parts of the village: Flamstone, Croucheston, Netton, Faulston, Bishopstone and Throope, but precise areas can be determined once I know how many people are prepared to volunteer. If you regularly walk around your part of the village this should not be too onerous a task.



INTRODUCTION OF PROOF OF ADDRESS SCHEME AT HOUSEHOLD RECYCLING CENTRES

From 9 April 2018, residents may be asked to provide a proof of address when visiting Wiltshire's household recycling centres. This must show that the visitor lives in Wiltshire.

A form of ID which shows your name and full address will be required. Acceptable examples include:

Driving licence

Council tax bill

Utility bill (either a printed or an electronic version is acceptable)

Your van and large trailer permit, if you are visiting the site in this type of vehicle.

Digital versions (e.g. an electronic copy of a utility bill which displays your address on a phone or tablet) are acceptable.

Without proof of address you may be asked to leave without being allowed to dispose of your waste. You may be asked for your proof of address each time you visit any of Wiltshire Council's recycling sites.


