BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

This note covers matters discussed at the meetings on both 13th November 2014 and 8th January 2015. The main issues were:

(i) The state of the **car park at Whitlock Rise**. It was agreed to contact Wiltshire Council again concerning the removal of abandoned vehicles, the condition of the car park surface and the state of the fencing. Wiltshire Council has now undertaken to do something about the fencing and has asked for a record to be kept of vehicles left for long periods in the car park. Arrangements are being made to do this.

(ii) **Speeding along the High Road**. Attention was drawn to the difficulty that school children have in getting from Meadow View to the bus stop at the top of Pitts Lane. Doing this necessitates walking along the road amidst speeding traffic. It was agreed to discuss with Wiltshire Council whether the verge could be cut shorter to enable children to walk along clear of the road surface. This was done and the grass has been cut. New warning signs have been erected on the C12 at the junction with **Flamstone Street** at the request of the Parish Council, together with "SLOW" markings on the road. A separate note about establishing a Community Speed Watch is included below.

(iii) There is a need for all of us to take more responsibility for **the "public realm"** in the village. Wiltshire Council can no longer be relied upon to do things they have done in the past, so, for example, if drains seemed to be clogged with leaves we should all take more responsibility and remove them, roadside hedges should be cut back, litter should be picked up etc. A poster on this is included in this STaB.

(iv) A tender has been accepted for the construction of the **basketball practice court** on the Recreation Field. This project will largely be paid for from the contributions received from developers when new houses are built in the village. It is hoped that construction can begin as soon as the worst of the winter weather is over. Steps are also being taken to clean up the play train prior to a repaint next Spring. The next project will involve an extension of the play equipment available for the younger children.

(v) There are continuing concerns about the traffic impact of the proposed redevelopment of **Faul-ston Barns**. This planning application remains to be determined by Wiltshire Council. Whilst it was agreed that, on balance, the Parish Council remains in favour of this development (as set out in comments submitted in September 2014) it is acknowledged that there are issues concerning road safety at the bend in the lane outside Faulston House and the width of the lane for passing vehicles. These matters were raised in the initial representations from the Parish Council but it was agreed to write a further letter to Wiltshire Council asking that the Highways Department bring forward proposals for dealing with these issues, perhaps including the provision of passing places, should planning permission be granted.

(vi) Much further work has been done by volunteers in the village to clear the river bank and ditches of fallen trees and undergrowth to improve river flow and reduce the risk of **flooding**. Problems have arisen with Wiltshire Council concerning their undertaking to extend road drains in Croucheston Drove and the clearance of drains in Netton Street. There are on-going discussions about these issues.

(vii) There are delays to the **High Speed Broadband** project, in particular the cabling work for the new cabinet opposite the Flamstone Street junction. Specialist teams need to be brought in to install the above ground section between Bishopstone and Broad Chalke. Further information on when the new cabinet will go live is being provided at the end of January and updates will be posted on the village website. Work is beginning on upgrading to fibre optic those lines served from Coombe Bissett exchange, but there is no timeframe for this yet.

(viii) Following the recent consultation, Wiltshire Council has decided that **garden refuse** collections (the green bins) will cease for December, January and February from December 2015.

(ix) Work to repair and re-open Mill Lane is due to begin in the first week of February 2015.

(x) Consideration was given to a proposal to provide a **bus shelter** at the bus stop (west bound) opposite Meadow View. Funding for bus shelters is under the control of the South West Wiltshire Area Board of Wiltshire Council. It was agreed to investigate costs, funding etc for consideration at the meeting in March.

(xi) A **budget and Precept** for 2015/16 has been agreed. The Precept (the money Bishopstone Parish Council gets from Wiltshire Council) will be set at a level which means that the related Parish Council share of the Council Tax demand in Bishopstone will remain the same as in 2014/15. This will produce income to the Parish Council of $\pm 5,511$ for 2015/16.

Community Speed Watch

There was discussion at both meetings on setting up a Community Speed Watch group in the village to monitor and report on speeding drivers, in particular in the 30mph limit section of the High Road past Meadow View and Whitlock Rise. The first step was for existing speeds to be measured. This was done over a week in December 2014. A total of 15,500 vehicle movements were measured in the week. The key statistic for these purposes is the speed at the 85th percentile (the speed 85% of vehicles are travelling at or below). This was 41.4mph. So a large number of drivers are exceeding the 30mph limit, and some 2500 (15%) by more than 41mph!

The Parish Council considers that this more than justifies the setting up of a CSW. Unfortunately, Wiltshire Police Authority disagree, saying that their criteria only allows a CSW if the speeding problem is at lesser speeds. At the High Road speeds a Speed Indicator Device is the appropriate response. The Parish Council has pointed out that a SID is already used at this location - and we now have clear evidence that this has very little impact on driver behaviour. This matter has been taken up with Wiltshire Councillors and the Police Authority, developments will be reported in a future STaB.

Next Parish Council Meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on **Thursday 12th March 2015**. It will be preceded by the Annual Parish Meeting which will begin at 7.00pm in the Village Hall. Tea and coffee will be available from 7.15pm. All are welcome to attend.

If you know you need to discuss other matters please either make a double appointment or book a separate time in which to see the doctor. Thank you for your understanding. When booking an appointment for your Medication Review please check with the Receptionist if you need a blood test prior to this appointment.

A Big Request - Medication Ordering

We have had an unprecedented amount of orders for repeat medication, some of which have not been required and have been returned. Would you please check your medicine cupboard before ordering to make sure you only order what you actually need. Thank you.

Booking Appointments Online

If you use the internet why not sign up for access to a secure website which will allow you to book an appointment with a doctor up to four weeks ahead. The process is straightforward and the system also allows you to order any repeat medication and answer the Friends and Family Test questionnaire (see below) as well.

It doesn't stop you from booking in all the usual ways it merely adds an additional one. Forms are available at the reception desk. You will be asked to show some form of proof of identity.

How was your experience today?

We would very much like to hear from you about your recent experience at either of our Practice Surgeries. Known as the Friends and Family Test, we have designed a form which asks you to rate your experience by selecting one of six answers. There is then space underneath to add comments if you so wish. We do appreciate that you are often in a hurry to get on with your life outside of the Surgery so it is possible to answer the questionnaire on line as well, details are at the reception desks. If you cannot see the form on the desk, please ask. The survey will run for the foreseeable future and we are asked to report each month on the number and type of responses received, so please fill in a form as often as you are able up to one per visit.
