BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council took place on Thursday 11th May 2017. Details are in the minutes of the meeting which are available on the village website (<u>www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk</u>). Ten members of the public were present.

Norman Barter, Butt Lane, Bishopstone George Brutton, Mill Lane, Bishopstone Piers Edwards, Broadchalke Road, Bishopstone Marion Foster, Drove Lane, Coombe Bissett John Gibbon, Manor Farm, Bishopstone Anita Smith, Netton Close, Bishopstone Alistair Thorne, Flamstone Street, Bishopstone This was the first meeting of the Council (see box for membership) since the elections on 4th May 2017.

Cllr John Gibbon was re-elected as Chairman of the Council, and Ali Thorne as Vice Chairman. Cllr Gibbon welcomed, in particular, Piers Edwards as the only new member of the Council.

The main issues considered at the meeting were:

- The problems caused in the village by the closure by Wiltshire Council of the High Road for surface road works. The closure during April had caused difficulty for villagers because the bus service had been suspended and many drivers from outside the village had ignored the official diversion and had tried to make their way through the village back roads. These problems were set to be repeated by another closure in May. Strong representations had been made to Wiltshire Council about the need to enforce the formal diversion and to provide stop/go boards, particularly in Mill Lane.
- Footpath along the High Road verge between Meadow View and Whitlock Rise. Wiltshire Council officers had raised objections to the proposal for an informal footpath along this verge to allow pedestrians, including children, to avoid walking along the busy road. A site meeting is to be held to discuss.
- **Community Defibrillator.** The defibrillator had been delivered and would be installed shortly at the Village Hall. Arrangements for a community event to raise awareness and demonstrate its use would be made for June.
- Whitlock Rise. Following an intervention by Wiltshire Councillor Jose Green a vehicle causing an obstruction in Whitlock Rise had been removed to the car park.
- **Commemorative Bench**. The new bench to commemorate the Queen's 90th birthday had also been delivered and would be installed in the footpath in The Alley shortly.
- **Bus service**. The bus company had been written to about over-crowding on the early morning services and the driving of some of their drivers. A reply is awaited.
- **Speeding on the A354**. A resident from the Blandford Road raised the issue of speeding along the A354 and asked that the Council press Wiltshire Council for a reduction in the speed limit. The number of houses and businesses along this road had increased and there were increasing traffic incidents. The dangers would be reduced if the limit was lowered from 60mph to 50mph. Whilst Councillors expressed support for raising the matter with Wiltshire Council, it was pointed out that parts of this stretch of road were in Coombe Bissett and Stratford Tony and that, to have any effect, any approach to Wiltshire Council should be a joint one. Residents agreed to take the matter up with those parishes to see if they would agree a joint approach.
- Annual Accounts. The Parish Council accounts for 2016/17 had been approved by the internal auditors. The Annual Return to the external auditors was discussed and agreed. A number of items of expenditure were also approved see minutes of meeting.
- **Faulston Barns**. The first new residents had now moved into Faulston Barns and welcomed to the village. Unfortunately, the site had also been subject to vandalism and graffiti shortly before this happened. The police have been informed.

The next meeting of the Council will be on Thursday 13th July 2017 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. All are welcome to attend.

Broad Chalke CE VA Primary School

10th Anniversary of the new school!

Ten years ago this year Broad Chalke Primary School moved to a beautiful new purpose built site. This would never have happened without the support of our wonderful community. It was controversial at times and not always easy but something had to be done to give our children the very best which this valley could provide and a mixture of determination, incredible fundraising and optimism resulted in a new school building which was not just fit for purpose, it was beyond expectations. Ten years on our village school continues to be a place of excellence and a place where our children can have the education which they deserve in order to give them the best start in life.

In recognition of this special anniversary, we would like to open our doors to the village community to say a special thank you to everyone who helped to make this dream a reality. On **Friday 30th June 2017** Broad Chalke Primary School will hold a day of Celebration. There will be a special assembly at 11.00 followed by a party lunch for the children.

I hope that the following descriptions will give just a flavour of life at our school:

1. **Pupils** – We have a total capacity for 210 pupils and currently have 206 pupils; there has been a steady increase over the past few years. Priority is always given to those who live in the

- 2. catchment area and the maximum class size is 30.
- 3. Staff We have 34 staff covering 50 different job roles. We are a great team and every
- 4. member of staff is valued for what they bring to the team.
- 5. Governors We have 14 Governors, with a range of diverse skills.

6. **Parents** – We encourage parents to get involved as parent helpers, governors or through FOBS, the Friends of Broad Chalke School. FOBS fundraise for the school and organise social events too. Parents are regularly invited in to join us for weekly Collective Worship as well as many other special events.

7. **Improvements** – Even though we have a beautiful school, we continue to improve it. Recent improvements have been made to the school kitchen, the car park, a new playground, playground markings, a new play trail and a new play area for Reception class. FOBS have been involved in the fundraising for many of these projects.

8. **Academic Standards –** The KS2 League Tables were published in December 2016 and show that in the 2016 KS2 SATs Broad Chalke was achieving well above the national average and is one of the top performing schools in the Salisbury area with SATs results in the top 1% nationally for attainment and in the top 2% for progress.

9. **Destination of school leavers 2016 -** 44% of children went to the Grammar Schools **and** 56% went to State Secondary Schools

Sports – Broad Chalke pupils enjoy a wide range of sports and great success in various competitions such as being:

district and county champions for boys' cricket district champions and 3rd in county for girls' cricket cluster champions and district finalists for netball district champions and 5th in county for hockey district champions and county finalists for tag rugby

2nd in district for girls' football and district champions for boys' football

9. **Visitors** - Parliament Education outreach workshops; Salisbury Playhouse drama coach; a 10. visitor from Sudan; Wiltshire Wildlife; Air Ambulance staff; a guide dog; a Royal Navy helicopter visit; a ventriloquist; author visits and a mosaic artist. The Magnard Ensemble performed a concert for us and we have also had recitals performed for us on the harp, piano and violin; an Indian 11. visitor led a workshop on Diwali. The Y6 class completed a Bikeability course to help them to be safer cyclists.

Trips - We have a number of trips throughout the year to inspire the pupils and enrich their studies, such as trips to: Beaulieu; the Ancient Technology Centre; Salisbury Museum and Stonehenge; Clayesmore choral day for the choir; Lulworth Cove; Ansty PYO; Throop Manor Downland; Mudeford beach and lifeboat station; a 5 day long residential at Lee Abbey in Devon; London for the Globe and the Golden Hind; Chalke Valley History Festival; Year 6 sleepover in school; 4 day Bristol residential; Salisbury

9. Cathedral; Messums Wiltshire; Salisbury Playhouse; Fleet Air Arm Museum and the 10. Tutankhamen Exhibition.

11. **Curriculum** - We have special curriculum days such as: a Victorian school day; a Fire of London day; a Dambusters themed week in Year 6; Performance Poetry competition; Broad Chalke's Got Talent competition and a wonderful end of term musical which last year was 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'. Year 5 won the Kingfisher Award for their work on the environment. Every year we hold an Arts Week. Last year beautiful mosaic pavers were produced by the children and installed in our sensory garden.

12. Charities – In 2016 we supported: The Trussell Trust, CRESS and Guide Dogs.

13. **School food** – We have excellent kitchen facilities and our own in house chef. We use local businesses wherever possible for high quality fresh produce.

14. **Village Links –** Play School links; School led Christmas carol singing at the Hub, Happy Circle and Chris Brown Day Centre are always invited to watch our Nativity play; gardening club run by local volunteers.

Church School – Our 4 core values of learning, caring, growing and sharing are integral to everything we do and we have various Church links:

The "Open the Book" team act out Bible stories for assemblies.

Weekly assembly led by one of the team vicars

Secret Agents Christian club

Revive church services in school once a month on a Sunday

Treasure Hunters Club in the Easter and Summer holidays

Our choir sang at the History Festival to commemorate the centenary of the battle of the Somme.

Remembrance service led by the school at the war memorial

We go to Broad Chalke Church for our Harvest Festival, Carol Service, Easter Service and Leavers Service.

The school is graded as Outstanding by Ofsted and as Outstanding by SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools).

As you can see, Broad Chalke Primary School continues to be a busy and thriving Church Primary School offering excellent opportunities to all of our pupils! I am very grateful for the support of our wonderful community who enrich village life in so many ways.

COMMUNITY DEFIBRILLATOR

In association with the Community Heartbeat Trust, Bishopstone Parish Council has now provided a portable automated external defibrillator (AED) for community use. It is located on the outside wall of the Village Hall in Butt Lane. The defibrillator has its own internal power supply and is contained in a carry pack that can be removed to any point in the village.

In the event of someone suffering a sudden cardiac arrest you should ring 999, begin CPR and ready the defibrillator. Our defibrillator is the fully automatic variety with voice and text prompts to tell the rescuer what to do – after the pads are attached to the victim the machine takes over, assesses the patient and delivers a shock, if needed.

These defibrillators are designed to be used by members of the public, with or without any formal training. They are easy to use - just follow the instructions. However, training is desirable and the CHT/SW Ambulance will be demonstrating the use of the defibrillator at a community event to be held on:

THURSDAY 15TH JUNE AT 7.00PM IN THE VILLAGE HALL

In the event of sudden cardiac arrest time is important. Early deployment of a defibrillator can make all the difference to survival. The more people who know how to use the portable defibrillator, the more chance there is of saving a life. Attending this demonstration will hopefully give you the confidence to use this life saving equipment, should the need arise.
