

The Speed Indicator Device began operation on the High Road on 2nd October. It is being shared with Broad Chalke and Bowerchalke Parish Councils and will rotate between the three authorities. It does appear to be having some effect in persuading drivers to slow down and observe the speed limit.

The South West Wiltshire Area Board has agreed to part fund the proposal to construct a footpath along the verge of the High Road between Meadow View and Whitlock Rise. The timing of completion of this project is now under discussion with the contractors.





We will also be asking for your votes for our film selection for our 2018 Season and there will be the inevitable appearance of Shaun the Sheep!



The Magic Lantern Society had a very successful showing over two nights on 22nd and 23rd September of **The Secret Spitfires**. This locally produced film about the manufacture of Spitfires in Salisbury played to capacity audiences on both nights and the organisers were regrettably turning away last minute applications to attend.

The superb film highlights a relatively unknown piece of local history. After the bombing of the Vickers Supermarine factory in Southampton on 24th and 26th September 1940 some of the manufacturing capacity was moved to Salisbury where, in security classified buildings, the production was able to continue before completed aircraft were flown out from High Post and Chattis Hill, near Stockbridge.

I first met Ivor Cummins in our church in late August 1997, when we had just moved in to Bishopstone. Since then, I have come to know him very well, with great respect. He was a shining example of a 'servant of the church', and gave a kind and simple welcome to all who came. He taught me much about the history of the church, and showed it off well to everyone.

After Gp Capt Alex Blythe died, he assumed the role of reading the names of the Village fallen on our War Memorial at our annual Service of Remembrance. His quiet and powerful Wiltshire tones brought the tragedy home to us all. He was a proud WW2 veteran of the Royal Artillery, from the beaches of Normandy to the bitter end in Germany. A short but heroic and life-changing period. We will salute him again this year, and miss his presence.

Ivor's sudden death before the congregation during the Harvest Festival, was a profound shock to us all. However, I think we are reassured that he died in the place he loved, surrounded by his friends, and during a service of thanksgiving, saying the prayers of intercession. We have all lost a dear friend. The church has lost a great servant. His family has lost a loving father, grandfather and great-grandfather. We offer them our heartfelt condolences.

We salute you Ivor, and may you rest in eternal peace.

This year we particularly remember the following men of the village who fell in 1917:

Pte Sidney Musselwhite, 15 Bn Royal Warwickshire Regiment, killed in action on 9th May, and r emembered at Arras memorial. His parents lived in Bishopstone.

Pte Frank Thick, 2nd Bn Wiltshire Regiment, killed in action on 31st July aged 27. He is remembered on the Menin Gate in Ypres, and his parents lived in Bishopstone.

Pte Charles Walker, 9th Bn Australian Infantry, died of wounds on 1st February in England aged 22. He is

Pte Charles Walker, 9th Bn Australian Infantry, died of wounds on 1st February in England aged 22. He is remembered in our graveyard on the only Commonwealth War Graves Commission headstone. He came from Longreach, Queensland where his parent lived. He is buried here because his uncle was our Rector at that time.

Pte Francis Bradby, 13th Bn East Kent Regiment, killed in action on 26th November aged 34.

Remembered forever on the memorial at Cambrai, Belgium, and his parents lived at Manor Farm, Stratford Tony.

We look forward to a good attendance at the service. It is hoped that medals and regimental ties will be to the fore.

It is with immense sadness that we will remember these men without the wonderful Wiltshire tones of Ivor Cummins to read their names. He was a Lance Bombardier in the RA during the advance from the beaches of Normandy until the end in Germany. His Father and his Uncle had served in the Great War before him. I

think we owe all these brave volunteers a special salute this year. We have only one other WW2 veteran in the village.

Following The Line: an 8-month Eurasian triathlon

An illustrated talk by Charlie Walker

In February 2017, Charile Walker began a nine-month, 9,000km triathion spanning the length of the perceived border between Europe and Asia, from the midwinter snowfields of the Russian arctic to the Bosporus in Istanbul.

'Following the Line' was an 8-month endurance feat. However, much more than that, it was an exploration into what it means to be Asian or European, what divides or unites the peoples on either side of the line, and the diversity of landscape, environment, religion and culture along the border that has traditionally demarcated East and West.

For more than two millennia, geographers and theologians have drawn arbitrary lines to divide 'enlightened' Europe from 'barbarous' Asia and to differentiate between 'us' and 'them.' In reality, however, the divide between Europe and Asia is simply conceptual; an European academic construct.

During this expedition, Charlie and Callie (his American expedition partner) experienced temperatures as low as -40°C, several arrests, the threat of bears, and the challenges of survival in some of the world's remotest and most inhospitable landscapes.


