1918 CENTENARY REMEMBRANCE **2018**





SUNDAY 11th NOVEMBER 2018

In this Centenary Year of the Armistice in 1918, we are holding our service at **1050 hrs on Sunday,11th of November**, to ensure we can have the 'Silence' at 1100hrs exact!

We are very honoured this year, that **His Grace the Bishop of Salisbury is taking our Remembrance** Service.

This year we will remember the following men of the village who fell in 1918:

- Pte A Gregory 284 Bn Machine Gun Corps, died of wounds on 11th January, aged 32. His parents lived in Bishopstone.
- Pte H Judd 5th Bn Canadian Infantry, died on 12th March, aged 37, born in Bishopstone and his parents lived in Pitton.
- LCpl C Hall 1st Bn Wiltshires, killed in action on 24th March aged 20, born in Harnham, parents lived in Salisbury and remembered in Strat-ford Tony.
- Dvr A Creasey 3 Battery 45 Brigade Royal Field Artillery, killed in action on 13th April, aged 27 born in Crowhurst and remembered in Stratford Tony.
- **Pte F W Loader** 10th Bn Royal Fusiliers, died of wounds on 16th May, aged 30, born in Bishopstone but his wife lived in Winterslow.
- Pte W J Hibberd 6th Bn Dorsets, died of wounds on 28th August, aged 32. He was born in Bishopstone, but his parents lived in Verwood.
- 2Lt R Penny 1st Bn Wiltshires killed in action on 1st September, aged 20, born in Bishopstone and his parents lived in Salisbury, on family stone in our churchyard.
- Dvr B J Read MM Royal Field Artillery died of wounds on 2nd October, aged 20. Born in Bemerton, his parents lived in Downton, remembered on his parent's grave in our churchyard.
- Pte L C Baker 7th Bn Wiltshires, killed in action on 7th October, aged 25. His parents lived in Faulstone.
- Dvr W Jacob 11 Field Company Royal Engineers, died on 9th November, aged 26 and his wife lived in Green Croft Street, Salisbury.



We look forward to a good attendance at the service, where uniform will be very welcome, and we hope others, retired and families, will wear medals and regimental ties and badges.

Collections for the RBL Poppy Appeal will begin on Saturday 27th October on the house-to-house basis as usual. Please support your collectors generously!

RIVER EBBLE

Landowners whose property borders the River Ebble and related waterways in the village are reminded of their obligation to help maintain the free flow of the river. Whilst we have just had one of the driest periods in history it will not take much to cause flooding if the flow of the river is impeded. It is therefore time to make sure that riverside growth is cut back and weed in the river is removed. Please remember that any cut weed should be removed from the river and not allowed to float downstream and clog the bridges and sluices.

The following sets out information on responsibilities in relation to watercourses and roadside ditches:

Watercourses

Under common law, a property or landowner is the riparian owner of any watercourse within or adjacent to that property or land. Where a watercourse is sited between two or more properties, each owner is equally responsible.

Owners of rivers, streams or ditches must accept water from an upstream neighbor and transfer this, together with drainage from their own property, downstream and undertake necessary maintenance of the water course to maintain the proper flow of water. The owner is responsible for the cost of maintenance including any culvert sections, pipe or other structure that allows water to flow underground or beneath another structure.

If a riparian land owner fails to carry out maintenance on an ordinary watercourse then the local authority can use powers under the Land Drainage Act 1991 to serve notice requiring them to undertake the necessary works. Failure to comply with such a notice may result in the Council undertaking the work and recharging the owner the costs of so doing.

Roadside ditches

The council has a right to drain the highway to any adjoining roadside ditch, which could include privately owned ditches. Rural roads rely to a great extent on ditches to remove water. To make sure these ditches remain effective, it is essential that they are kept in good condition. Common law imposes a duty on the owner of land adjoining a highway to maintain those ditches that provide natural drainage to both the land and highway. In the majority of cases the responsibility for ditch maintenance rests with the adjacent landowner.

A ditch on the side of a road which drains water from private land (and could be on either side of a private fence or hedgerow) is the responsibility of the landowner to maintain so it doesn't cause flooding to the highway. The ditch may still take water that drains from the highway, but the ditch's principal purpose is to drain water from private land. A ditch that was created by the council for the sole purpose of draining water from the highway is the responsibility of the council to maintain. However, these are very few in number across the county.

bar (very appropriately!), and there is another memorial to those who fell in the Great War, but it lists 18 names. That is 3 more than on the official memorial plaque in the church. Why is that?



The story goes on. Using a new website (Wiltshiresoldiers), we find several men from the village who have no memorial, except their Commonwealth War Grave. There are 6 men from Bishopstone and Stratford Tony who have no memorial, a further 4 who are named on the Salisbury City Memorial, and 4 on the Coombe Bissett Memorial, and one in Broad Chalke. There is also an Australian soldier in our churchyard who lies under our only Commonwealth War Graves Commission headstone. There are 2 brothers remembered on their parents' grave in our churchyard, who have no connection to Bishopstone .

Stratford Tony has no memorial plaque, even though one Great War death has a CWGC headstone in their churchyard.

So, there are many more Bishopstonians who gave their lives in the Great War than are remembered in our church. It seems that about 30 men from or with connections to the

village by birth or next of kin, gave their lives for our freedom. This year, on the Centenary of the Armistice, we will remember them all.

Following pages has a list of them and their connection to the village, listed under the places where they are named, or not named:

So, we now have 32 names of men who fell in the Great War with a direct connection with Bishopstone and Stratford Tony. Many are remembered on other memorials, and some have no memorial locally. There are 4 who could be added in our church, and 4 who could be included in a memorial in Stratford Tony. Should we now consider making these memorials in this Centenary Year?

Then there are also the many men who joined up, did their duty and returned home, some wounded and others unscathed. That is another interesting story. If you know of any of these men, please let us have the story, to allow us to build up a better picture of the brave support given by Bishopstone and Stratford Tony during the Great War. Also, what about the women who took over so many of the men's jobs when they answered the Call to Arms? Do you have stories of granny or great-granny during the Great War?

I wonder why there are only 15 names in the church, and 18 on the Village Hall memorial? Who is C W Read, for whom we have no details? Why are 3 men from Bishopstone and 3 from Stratford Tony without any

memorial in either church? Who designed, made and paid for the brass memorial in the church? Who decided which names were included? What percentage of the two villages' male population were killed by the War? How many went off to fight and came back home afterwards?

Mercifully, there were only 2 sets of brothers killed. Francis and John Bradby died within a month of each other in 1917, their parents living at Manor Farm, Stratford Tony. James

and Ralph Read died in 1916 and 1918, their parents Sidney and Emma living in Downton at that time. However, Sidney and Emma are buried in our churchyard, with the names of their sons on each side of the grave perimeter stones. Valentine Walker, who died in 1917, was born in Queensland and his parents lived there, but he lies under a CWGC headstone because his uncle was Rector here when he died.

There is a deal more research to be done, and much can come from the families of villagers still here. If you have a story, please share it with us. It will ensure that Remembrance in future is more vivid and that the names will be for ever remembered in November. It will help to bring to life the names on that brass Memorial plaque in the Church.

THE BISHOPSTONE MAGIC LANTERN SOCIETY

The Magic Lantern Society will show "**All Quiet on the Western Front**" on **Friday 9 November** in Bishopstone Village Hall.

The timing of this screening is deliberate as this vintage anti-war film is shown two days before the 100th Anniversary of the end of World War 1. Any surplus from this showing is being donated to the village's Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal.

This is a classic film and is unusual in many aspects. First, it is a fairly faithful adaptation of Erich Maria Remarque's 1929 best selling novel that follows a group of idealistic friends from college to volunteer serving in the German Army and their subsequent gradual demise.

But more importantly It was produced in 1930 in America using German veteran military extras. Prior to this there had been a marked reluctance to revisit the awful memories of this cataclysmic war for a decade or more but this film was made just as the spectre of another global conflict was beginning to materialise.

The film's pacifist and German stance made the movie controversial and even banned in many European countries. Nevertheless it deservingly won Oscars for Best Film and Best Director.

This film very definitely does not glorify war, rather it shows it to be a catastrophic and traumatic period of our history......a must see.

VILLAGE MEMORIES

NORMAN BARTER



EARLIEST MEMORIES

I had polio as a child and was taken to the Isolation Unit at Old Sarum, then to Salisbury and after that to Odstock Hospital. I remember having my toys in the Isolation Unit, which were kept there and then destroyed. My sister was also in hospital at the same time, as she had fallen off a wall in the garden. I loved racing in my silver pedal car. I remember Nigger Webb taking me on the back of his pushbike to the bus stop where I caught the bus with Rob Thorne to school in Salisbury. I spent a lot of time until I was 12 years old going around to agricultural shows with my parents, who exhibited their honey, and my mother made wax flowers. They were unbeaten at all the shows.

I saw television for the first time in the mid 1950s. As I always like growing things I had small plot for myself.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU LIVED IN BISHOPSTONE?

74 years. I was adopted by Stan and Sylvia Barter when I was a few days old.

HAVE YOU ALWAYS LIVED IN THE SAME HOUSE HERE?

25 years at Bridge House followed by 49 years at Vella House, which was built in 1877.

SCHOOL

I went to Uplands School off Castle Road in Salisbury. Ros Everett was the head teacher and Olive Moody also taught there. Then I went to St Probus in Manor Road, Salisbury, and at 11 years I passed the 11+ to Bishop Wordsworth School.

HOW DID YOU MEET YOUR WIFE?

On the tennis court in The Close, which is now a car park! Margaret was at the Teachers Training College in Salisbury. I had always been determined <u>not</u> to marry a Young Conservative! We were married in Kent on 27 September 1969. Margaret was soon in demand in the Chalke Valley as a music teacher.

WORK

I took over the watercress business from my father in 1980 and we had beds in Bishopstone from 1890, and at Coombe Bissett (which had been built in 1932). The Bishopstone beds produced water from natural springs, but the water in Coombe Bissett had to be pumped. When the business closed in 2001 the Bishopstone beds were turned into 2 small fishing lakes which, in my view, are an enhancement to the village.

WHAT ARE YOUR INTERESTS AND HOBBIES?

Sports - tennis, squash, badminton - now watching, not participating! Gardening, after giving up the watercress beds, because of hip problems etc. Interests – Politics, and I have chaired various organisations here and in the South of England. Also we enjoy spending time with our grandchildren and sharing their progress.

WHAT WAS YOUR FAVOURITE HOLIDAY?

Most of my life I worked on my own, 7 days a week, so we didn't have many holidays. I have always enjoyed driving, so 2 holidays that stand out are a caravan holiday near Beccles in Norfolk while Robin and Ian were choristers at King's College Cambridge. Also a family caravan holiday in Andorra. Now we explore more exotic locations.

YOUR FAVOURITE BOOK

I don't read too many books as I would read to the detriment of everything else that needs to be done. So it's mostly holiday reading. I enjoy the National Geographic Magazine.

FAVOURITE MUSIC & THEATRE

Widor's Toccata and Fugue which was played at our wedding. Hymn music and musical shows.

Live theatre and I enjoy Shakespeare when it is well done.

IMPORTANT THINGS YOU'VE LEARNED IN LIFE

Always remember work **with** people and don't order them about. This has served me well over the years.

My mother wrote in my autograph book when I was a child: 'If you do not at first succeed, try and try again.'

My father taught me how to handle people which was particularly helpful in all my committee work. It gives me pleasure to try and do good for the village, because I'm so fortunate to live here in Bishopstone.
