DOG FOULING

Dog owners/walkers failing to clear up after their pets is, once again, becoming a problem in the village. Dog mess is being left on paths and on grassed areas where children play.

The whole of Wiltshire is covered by a Dog Control Order which makes it an offence to allow a dog to foul and not to clear it up immediately. Bag it and bin it - in your domestic waste bin or any street bin, such as those along the High Road.

Wiltshire's Dog Wardens have the power to issue fixed penalty notices of £75 to anyone seen not clearing up after their dog. This could also lead to prosecution and fine of up to £1000. The Parish Council will be asking the Dog Wardens to visit our village.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY ... 12th NOVEMBER 2017



This year Remembrance Sunday falls on the 12th of November, and we will hold our Service of Remembrance in the church, starting at 1050 hrs (10.50 am), to ensure we can have the

silence at 1100hrs exact!

We are delighted that Rev Canon Ann Philp we take the service for us.

This year we particularly remember the following men of the

village who fell in 1917:

Pte Sidney Musselwhite, 15 Bn Royal Warwickshire Regiment, killed in action on 9th May. Pte Frank Thick, 2nd Bn Wiltshire Regiment, killed in action on 31st July aged 27. Pte Charles Walker, 9th Bn Australian Infantry, died of wounds on 1st February in England aged 22.

Pte Francis Bradby, 13th Bn East Kent Regiment, killed in action on 26th November aged 34.

We look forward to a good attendance from the village. Collections for the RBL Poppy Appeal will begin on Saturday 28th October on the house-to-house basis as usual. Any queries should be addressed to me, James Thompson , tel 780683.

BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

The minutes of the Parish Council meeting which took place on Thursday 14th September 2017 are available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk). The main items discussed were:

- Future Development of the Croucheston Mill site. Mr Geoffrey Stevens of Mole Valley Farmers attended the meeting. He said that MVF were again considering the future of the Croucheston Mill site. Unsuccessful applications for planning permission for housing had been made in the past. In theory the site could be refurbished for commercial uses, but redevelopment for a small number of houses still seemed more appropriate. If nothing is done there was a risk that the condition of the building might deteriorate further. The purpose of this discussion was to share ideas on future use of the site. After which MFV would develop more detailed proposals for further discussion with the Parish Council.
- Mike Ash reminded the meeting that the Bishopstone Plan had recommended that this site, like Faulston • Barns, should be considered for housing use. However, it was open to question whether Wiltshire Council would consider this site consistent with their policy of only allowing "infilling". Nevertheless, they had approved Faulston Barns.
- In an open discussion a wide variety of views were expressed. Suggestions ranged from leaving the site as it • is, as a relic of the agricultural past of the village, or reusing it for agricultural purposes to clearance and redevelopment for housing. Concern was expressed about the possible traffic impacts on what are narrow country lanes, which are certainly not suitable for modern agricultural vehicles and machinery. However, it was recognised that traffic impacts would not be great if the development were restricted to two or three houses. There were issues to be considered of flooding and sewage disposal. There was strong support for some smaller housing units, which might be more affordable to younger families. Alternatively, such houses might be attractive to older people from the village wanting to 'downsize", though the relative remoteness of the site from the bus service, village hall and pub were noted. A strong preference was expressed for the design of any new houses to be in keeping with the village vernacular. It was suggested that the footpath to Stoke Farthing, through the site, could be developed as a cycle path, to the school, sports centre etc at Broad Chalke. This would need the cooperation of other landowners, but the mill scheme could set the ball rolling.
- Mr Stevens undertook to consider very carefully all the views that had been expressed and to develop some more detailed ideas for discussion in the future.
- High Road Footpath. Estimates had been received for the construction of an informal path along the high-• way verge on the south side of the High Road between Meadow View and Whitlock Rise. The Community Area Transport Group had indicated support for the project and an application for a 50% grant had been made to the South West Wiltshire Area Board. This will be considered in October.
- Speed Indicator Device. Agreement had been reached with Broad Chalke and Bowerchalke Parish Councils to set up a consortium to own and operate a Speed Indicator Device (SID) as part of a project initiated by the South West Wiltshire Area Board. A grant of £1,500 had been received from SWWAB. Bishopstone's share of the remaining cost was £681.60. A battery operated SID, with solar panel charging, which will indicate the actual speed of vehicles, with accompanying "slow down" signal when appropriate, had now been purchased and would be used in the 30mph limit area past Whitlock Rise. This would support the work of the Community Speed Watch team.
- Trees to commemorate WW1. Consideration was given to a proposal being co-ordinated by Wiltshire Council and the Woodland Trust to plant trees in 2019 to commemorate every soldier from Wiltshire killed in WW1. It is proposed to plant a central memorial woodland and to invite parishes to plant trees in their area. In Bishopstone this might mean planting 16 trees. These could be in groups (eg in the corners of the Recreation Field) or along a hedgerow at the side of the field. It was agreed to express an interest in this project but to wait for more information on species of trees etc before going further.

The next meeting of the Council will be on Thursday 9th November 2017 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. The agenda for the meeting will be available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk) a week before the meeting. All are welcome to attend. 6

DID YOU KNOW FROM THE PCC?

For the last 5 years, a dedicated team of members of the SARUM NADFAS (now called Sarum Arts Society) have been conducting a detailed recording in our church. This was led by Anne Stutchbury (supported by Alan!), and during the project they examined all the interior of the church in great detail, under 9 sections.

They examined, described, photographed (by Mike Ash) and illustrated the memorials (We now know the Rev Conham memorial), the metalwork (The brass cross and candlesticks), the stonework (The sedilia and the Montgom-

ery Tomb), the woodwork (On the pulpit and behind the high altar), the textiles (The altar frontals and the robes), the paintings (The great Royal coat of arms), the library (Bibles, records and prayer books), the windows (North, south, great east and west), and miscellaneous items.

The findings have been collated into a truly magnificent purple bound book, to be kept by the PCC for ever. This was handed over to the Vicar and the PCC during the splendid service on Sunday 17th September, when many from the village and the valley were present. We are most grateful for this record of all we possess and are, and will keep the book carefully. It is sincerely hoped that it will be open in the church for public view in the future, from time to time.

STOCKTAKING

As a professionally run business, one of the things we have to do each year is a stocktake ie accurately checking our inventory, which happens at this time of year as part of finalising our year end accounts. Under Ellen's supervision this is happening on 1st October, when a number of volunteers have agreed to help with what is a detailed and painstaking task. We are most grateful to all those who have agreed to help particularly as it is over a weekend. One of the possible consequences of a stocktake is that there may be a slight shortage of one or two items but fear not, this will to be put right very quickly.

VOLUNTEERS

Talking about stocktaking, a recent survey has revealed that **thirty five** of our volunteers have been with us since the HUB first opened. This is yet another demonstration of the commitment from our local community without whom we would not have enjoyed so much success. We are always keen to show our appreciation for the work of the volunteers and one way of doing this is by holding an annual "thank you" party which this year will be taking place in the middle of October in a hostelry not a million miles from the HUB

LOCAL SUPPLIERS.

Each month we like to highlight one or two of our local suppliers who have been with us for some time. This month we are featuring, firstly, **Chalke Valley Produce**, run by Laura Loncar, and which has been supplying the shop since we opened. Her seasonal vegetables are grown on a hill between Bowerchalke and Woodyates Now that it is officially Autumn, Laura's supply of vegetables is changing to reflect the new season. Expect to see on display: kale, (peppery flavoured Catell Nero variety); cabbage; winter salad bags containing mizuna leaves (from the Brassica species), mibuna leaves (peppery flavoured) and red mustard frills (deep red shoots with a mild mustard flavour).. Apparently some people are a bit weary of red onion squash which is also available but Laura says it is delicious particularly when roasted or made into a soup.

Secondly, we are introducing a new beer to our range from the **Sixpenny Brewery**, another regular supplier.. This small local brewery was originally based in Sixpenny Handley but has recently moved to new premises near Cranborne. Their Rushmore Gold beer is now available in the shop and is described as a *"refreshing golden real ale beer, clean and smooth tasting with a distinctive citrus hop aroma and flavour"* Irresistible if you're are a beer drinker!

Our meat suppliers are all small local businesses and so need as much notice as possible as they get busy in the build up to Christmas. Following The Line: an 8-month Eurasian triathlon

An illustrated talk by Charlie Walker

In February 2017, Charlle Walker began a nine-month, 9,000km triathion spanning the length of the perceived border between Europe and Asia, from the midwinter snowfields of the Russian arctic to the Bosporus in Istanbul.

'Following the Line' was an 8-month endurance feat. However, much more than that, it was an exploration into what it means to be Asian or European, what divides or unites the peoples on either side of the line, and the diversity of landscape, environment, religion and culture along the border that has traditionally demarcated East and West.

For more than two millennia, geographers and theologians have drawn arbitrary lines to divide 'enlightened' Europe from 'barbarous' Asia and to differentiate between 'us' and 'them.' In reality, however, the divide between Europe and Asia is simply conceptual; an European academic construct.

During this expedition, Charlie and Callie (his American expedition partner) experienced temperatures as low as -40°C, several arrests, the threat of bears, and the challenges of survival in some of the world's remotest and most inhospitable landscapes.
